THEME: Anti-bullying

- New this year, our talent show has a theme! Anti-bullying. We would like to use this opportunity and our student's talents to shine a light on bullying, while creating a fun, supportive and positive show.
- We are asking our students participating this year to use their performance to reflect an anti-bullying message. This could be done directly with a message to stop bullying, or indirectly with a message of support, love, kindness etc.

OPENING NUMBER – ICS STOMPS Out Bullying

- Also new this year, we are offering a choreographed opening number for any student interested in participating. This opening number will be based on STOMP. Details will be determined based on the number of participants. Practice times will be announced ASAP.

The talent show committee will be available during lunch a day in February to discuss any questions and offer support or advice for the students regarding their performances or questions relating to the Opening Number.

AUDITION REQUIREMENTS:

- Open to students in grades Kindergarten through 8.
- Act CANNOT exceed 3 minutes.
 - Music must be cut to end within the required time constraints prior to audition.
 - Trimming songs is possible within iTunes.
 - AVS editor is also an easy to use and free downloadable program.
- Each student may only participate in 1 performance in the show. (Exception for 8th grade group performance)
- Content must be appropriate and in line with the ideals and expectations of the school.

- Kidz Bop has appropriate versions of today's popular music; consider this as an alternative.
- **Dates:**
 - Rehearsal: April 24thth, 3-6pm
 - The rehearsal will run in order of the show to finalize all details necessary.
 - All performances must be performed without assistance, and students should dress in full costumes and use any props necessary.
 - Students will be dismissed to the gym on the day of rehearsal, and expected to change/prepare for their time slot as soon as possible.
 - Students will be dismissed immediately after their rehearsal.

 - Evening Show 6:30pm

 - Each performance is required to send an audition video to ensure that they have met the requirements. Please email your audition videos to icstalent2020@gmail.com.

 - MC's are required to memorize!
 - Number of MCs are limited. Not all submissions can be accepted.
- The order of the show will be organized at the discretion of the Talent Show Team based on performance types to balance the entertainment factor. All students will be expected to remain at the show until the Finale performance is over.
