

Father Burl comes to us from Bethesda-by-the-Sea in Palm Beach, Florida, where he has served as Associate for Pastoral Care, Christian Education, and Outreach. He provides leadership in those areas for a parish of roughly 1200 members and manages the distribution of outreach funds of more than \$600,000 annually. He served as Priest-in-Charge during the Rector's five-month sabbatical and is also a Police Chaplain for the Town of Palm Beach.

Father Burl is an inspiring and transcendent preacher, an academic who can translate scripture to the present day, a careful and patient listener, and a compassionate and thoughtful manager who will ensure The Falls Church's continued growth. Before Bethesda-by-the-Sea, Father Burl was a Priest and Educator. He was a curate at a rural church in Georgia and held the positions of Dean, Chaplain, and Teacher at Episcopal Schools in North Carolina and Georgia, and right here in our backyard at St. Stephen's and St. Agnes in Alexandria.

Father Burl received his M.Div. from Yale, which includes his Diploma in Anglican Studies from Berkeley Divinity School and a Certificate of Study from the Institute of Sacred Music, also at Yale. His undergraduate degree is in English and Organ Performance from Millsaps College in Jackson, MS.

He is a native of Natchez, MS, and a graduate of Trinity Episcopal Day School there. Father Burl will come to the Rectory with his husband Bob Henkel, who is Director of Publications for the American Society of Nephrology. They will be joined in the Rectory by Blue, an occasionally affectionate ragdoll cat. He loves gardening, historic preservation, and genetic genealogy. In Father Burl's words, he seeks to be "an accessible, relational, and pastoral priest dedicated to the breadth of diversity of The Episcopal Church with a visionary commitment to its voice."
