Thank you for considering me to serve as a member of the vestry at The Falls Church Episcopal. I still remember the day in September 2017 when my wife, Betsy and I came to our first 11:15 service at the historic church. We were so warmly greeted by Paul Rosbott, and have never looked back since then in enjoying the deeply felt and friendly worship services here. My wife and I moved to the Falls Church area after my retirement from 45 years as a double bassist in the Chicago Symphony to be close to our daughter, Jennifer Mondie and our grandson, Campbell who live in D.C. Jenny has served 25 years as a violist member of the National Symphony Orchestra. Our son, Dan is a cellist in the Arkansas Symphony and works as a CPA for Blue Cross. Betsy was a professional violinist in the Chicago area.
