**Rev. Dr. Chip Hardwick**

The Presbyterian Mission Agency lets seven marks for vitality, but they have more to do with being faithful than they do with being sustainable. How are faithfulness and sustainability related? Which is more important? Join Interim Synod Executive Chip Hardwick, Adjunct Professor of Congregational Vitality in Dubuque Seminary's DMin Program, for this workshop, which will minor on PowerPoint and major on conversation.

The Rev. Dr. Charles “Chip” Hardwick, currently serves as the transitional synod executive for the Synod of the Covenant. Chip, a PC(USA) Minister, has served as the director of theology, formation, and evangelism for the Presbyterian Mission Agency of the PC(USA) and has served churches in Illinois and Georgia. In addition to his Princeton Theological Seminary degrees, Chip is a member of the Presidential Advisory Committee at Alma College, a trustee at Princeton Theological Seminary, and an adjunct professor in Dubuque Seminary’s Doctor of Ministry program. He writes the Bible Explorations column for Presbyterians Today and contributes to These Days and The Presbyterian Outlook. His Outlook article “My Mom and Me: Theological Comfort and the Suicide Crisis” won first place in its category in the 2018 Associated Church Press Awards. His devotional book Crossbound was published for Lent 2015.
