**KEYNOTE SPEAKER: PAUL HILTZ**

Paul Hiltz has been President and CEO of Naples Community Healthcare System since September of 2019. Prior to that he served as the President and CEO of Mercy Medical Center in Canton, Ohio. Mr. Hiltz joined Mercy in July of 2017.

Before this position, Mr. Hiltz was a Senior Executive with Mercy Health (formerly Catholic Health Partners) in Cincinnati, Ohio, serving in multiple capacities, including President and CEO of Mercy Hospital – Mt. Airy. He also served as President and CEO of the Springfield, Ohio Region, where he was responsible for two Acute Care Hospitals, two Skilled Nursing Facilities, and a Free-Standing Cancer Center.
