**Florida Department of Health Updates New COVID-19 Cases, Announces Thirty-Six Deaths Related to COVID-19
~57,293 positive cases in Florida residents and 1,471 positive cases in non-Florida residents~**

TALLAHASSEE, Fla. —The Florida Department of Health (DOH), in order to provide more comprehensive data, releases a report on COVID-19 cases in Florida once per day. The DOH COVID-19 dashboard is also providing updates once per day. The state also provides a report detailing surveillance data for every Florida county, which is available [here](#).

Test results for more than 28,600 individuals were reported to DOH as of midnight, on Tuesday, June 2. Today, as reported at 11 a.m., there are:

- 1,317 new positive COVID-19 cases (1,292 Florida residents and 25 non-Florida residents)
- 36 Florida resident deaths related to COVID-19

The percent of those testing positive for COVID-19 overall is 5 percent. On June 2, 4.6 percent of new cases** tested positive.

There are a total of 58,764 Florida cases*** with 2,566 deaths related to COVID-19.

Since data reported at 11 a.m. on June 3, the deaths of seventy Florida residents who tested positive for COVID-19 have been reported in Alachua, Baker, Broward, Charlotte, Clay, Dade, Duval, Escambia, Hendry, Hillsborough, Lee, Palm Beach, Polk and Volusia counties.
