Dr. Amanda Philyaw Perez is an Assistant Professor and the state Food Systems and Food Safety Specialist with the University of Arkansas System Division of Agriculture Cooperative Extension Service. She holds a master and a doctorate in Public Health with her graduate work focusing on Local and Community Food Systems Development. Dr. Philyaw Perez oversees multiple state programs including the new FDA Food Safety Modernization Act's (FSMA) Produce Safety Rule, Southern Center for Food Safety State Leader, Southern Regional Representative for the National Association for Community Development Extension, and is the lead PI on a Local Foods Promotion Program Grant that is developing three food hubs in Arkansas known as the Share Grounds. She has a passion for helping farmers remain viable and communities recognize the value of local solutions.



Julia Fryer is a program associate for the University of Arkansas System Division of Agriculture Cooperative Extension Service working out of the Little Rock State Office. Julia works in food systems and food safety, providing education for fruit and vegetable farmers on produce safety and local food systems development. Julia has a bachelor's degree in environmental, soil, and water sciences and a master's degree in soil fertility from the University of Arkansas.
