What Is The Importance Of This Course?

The use of prescription and non-prescription opioids has dramatically increased in New York State. Healthcare providers who prescribe opioid analgesics must understand and demonstrate ongoing knowledge of pain management, palliative care, and addiction.

As a result, NYS has mandated a minimum of 3 hours of CME in 8 clinical areas to be completed by July 1, 2017. This online course is **FREE to all ACP members AND non-members.**

Why Should I Take This course?

NYS Public Health Law Section 3309-A requires professionals licensed under Title 8 of the NYS Education Law with a valid DEA number and every medical resident prescribing under a hospital or facility DEA number to complete a 3-hour training course covering: state and federal laws on the prescribing of controlled substances, pain management, appropriate prescribing, managing acute pain, palliative medicine, prevention/screening/signs of addiction, responses to abuse and addiction and end of life care by July 1, 2017.

When Must This Course Be Completed?*

The online course is available NOW and **MUST be completed by July 1, 2017 and every three years thereafter.** This online educational activity allows you to take the course at your own pace and complete the 3-hour training as your schedule permits. This course is accredited for 3-hours of CME Category I Credits™ and 3 MOC points.
