Changes occur rapidly in the field of HIV Medicine. This course is designed to provide practitioners with the most up-to-date clinical information on a variety of topics to assist in their care of patients living with HIV. Presentation formats include didactic sessions and interactive case presentations, followed by question and answer periods.

By the end of the activity, the learner should be able to:

- Review common medications used in HIV treatment in 2019.
- Describe implications of most recent guideline recommendations as they relate to what antiretroviral therapy to start in naive patients, and when to start.
- Discuss the rationale for the rapid initiation of antiretroviral therapy following an HIV diagnosis.
- Discuss the clinical manifestations of syphilis and recommended treatment regimens.
- Discuss the current guidelines for initiating HIV pre-exposure prophylaxis (PrEP) and best practices for implementation in a clinical setting.
- Discuss the epidemiology of opioid overdose, medication assisted treatment therapies and overdose interventions.
