Farak's arrest on Jan. 18, 2013, came four months after Annie Dookhan was arrested for falsifying results at the Boston crime lab. Both women pleaded guilty to their misdeeds, which ultimately resulted in the dismissal of more than 61,000 drug charges involving over 37,000 cases, according to a September report from the ACLU of Massachusetts.
