


## WHAT ARE YOU READING???

*Terry Burke-Eiserling Friends Chair, shares her latest read: The Library Book by Susan Orlean*

This book had been recommended to me as it is a **true story** of the 1986 fire, that may have been arson, at the Los Angeles Central Library destroying half a million books and damaging seven hundred thousand more. The author of this book did a fantastic job of explaining the history of libraries in the United States, including the inner workings of libraries, which I found fascinating and makes me want to learn more.



I was so surprised that the early years of library management were dominated by men, opinionated men, who didn't seem to have much respect for the women workers who loved libraries and were great forward thinkers. I never knew libraries stored and maintained files of historical evidence of our growth and changes in our communities.

I have to say I hadn't thought about the movement of books and materials from one space to another to get it in your hands or to our library until I read this book. This brings one up to the technological changes in our libraries and the ebook system that many of you use to obtain your books.


This was not a dry or boring read at all, very interesting. I loved how the community, businesses, and individuals rallied to save the books and materials after the fire. How businesses stepped up to store thousands of books, and to help dry them. How they were handled and what determined what was kept and what was lost and needed replacing. The fundraising that took place to replace lost and precious items, how people donated collections to replace items lost.

The arsonist...you really need to read the book, great character development throughout the book. Did he set fire to the Library? It isn't until the very end that maybe you can answer that question. Excellent read!!

Cormoran Strike Mystery Series by Robert Galbraith

Just finished the latest book in the Cormoran Strike mystery series, Troubled Blood, and can hardly wait to tell you about it. In Troubled Blood, private detective Cormoran Strike, and his partner at the detective agency, Robin Endicott, are presented with a very old missing person cold case and face numerous twists and turns, false starts, dead-end leads, provocative hints—and dangers. I especially enjoy how the author, Robert Galbraith (pen name of J. K. Rowling of Harry Potter fame), develops the characters and relationships along the way. Galbraith/Rowling can really write and I felt as if I was "right there" with Strike and Endicott as they solve mysteries and grow as human beings. Thoroughly adult stories that I can recommend wholeheartedly, and I would strongly suggest beginning with the first book, The Cuckoo's Calling. They are all first-rate reads
