Happy 110th birthday Woman's Club of Lakeside

Informational facts and events were provided from the Woman's Club meeting minutes dating back to the 1920's and the Lakeside Historical Society archives.

In the 1920's some wonderful events were happening with the Woman's Club and Lakeside, CA.

1. The Woman's club was 10 years old in 1920.
2. Women were allowed to vote in August 1920.
3. November 1920, the Woman's Club held a bazaar and sold a variety of items. The quilts and rugs which sold brought in \$70.00.
4. December 3, 1920 Cuyamaca Bank in El Cajon created an agreement for \$1,710.00 to transfer the deed title between the Louis & Amelia Forney and the D.H. & Alma Andres family which led to the purchase of the building on Lot 10 and block 17 northeast corner. Today this is the corner of Maine Ave and Lakeshore Dr. (The 1920 deed paper is in a Woman's Club record book)
5. The Woman's club meeting on January 13, 1921 was cancelled due to a small pox quarantine.
6. February 1, 1921 it is noted that Bessie Mallory put up \$1,500 to help the Woman's Club secure the structure for their clubhouse. The club would pay Bessie the money back in 4 years including 6% interest.
7. The conversation of selling the clubhouse started at a meeting held on January 18, 1924. The discussion at that time had the price at \$4,000 for cash or \$4,500 if terms were needed.
8. The building was sold in 1945 for \$5,000 to John Rocchio who remodeled it into a "very modern" drug store. The Woman's Club ended up giving the VFW \$3,500 and then they lent the VFW another \$1,500. Over the years only \$200.00 was paid back from the original \$1,500 loan.
9. In October 1924, the Woman's Club bought their first Player piano from Maw Gray Music for \$395.00.



A few other 1920 facts for Lakeside, CA 92040

- The Lakeside Inn was dismantled in 1920. Rumors were, it burned down and was demolished which are not true.
- The first rodeo was organized on July 5, 1920 by Bill Kuhner
- The Clevenger home was built in 1920, today it is Mad Max's.
