

WHATEVER HAPPENED TO THE LAKESIDE ROLL OF HONOR?



The Lakeside Roll of Honor once stood proudly in the front yard of the old community church on Maine Avenue. This memorial was dedicated on November 11, 1944, with only 173 names initially on it (per a San Diego Union photo and story), so these photos came later than that. The final resting place of this local WWII monument are one of our history's mysteries. (LHS Archives)

When people ask about Lakeside history, the same questions often come up: Were there any cemeteries here? (No.) Why did they tear down the Lakeside Inn? (Long story.) Why do they call it Lakeside? (uh ... the lake.) But another common question has yet to be answered and continues to be one of Lakeside history's biggest mysteries: Whatever happen to the WWII Honor Roll?

In case you aren't familiar with it, the Honor Roll was displayed in front of the then-Lakeside Community Presbyterian Church on Maine Avenue, to pay respect to the local boys fighting across the seas during World War II.

The names of our Lakesiders were originally displayed on the El Cajon Honor Roll board, but a War Memorial Fund Committee was formed to create an independent group to honor Lakeside soldiers. The first meeting was held in October 1944 and the group wanted to set the dedication for Armistice (now Veterans) Day on the following November 11th. They authorized the board to "serve" until one year after victory in WWII (they were confident). The yard in front of the community church was selected for the monument.

Considerable money was spent by Lakeside merchants for the construction. Materials were donated by L.F. Lake, Herman Schiller built and installed it, and flood lights were donated by T.B. Smiley. An anonymous donor supplied the materials and paint. As the committee had wished, the Honor Roll Board was formally dedicated on November 11, 1944.

The names of 173 were initially displayed on the board, which eventually grew by about 100 more, including at least five "Gold Star" to commemorate our boys who had given their lives in the war effort.

The plan was always for a larger, more permanent memorial. Though exactly how long it stood in front of the old church is not known (maybe as late as 1948), the Honor Roll was eventually to be moved to the new War Memorial Building, then under construction, and erected at the entrance of the auditorium. But did it ever get there? No one seems to know.

An undated newspaper story indicated the Honor Roll "reportedly" moved to the front of the War Memorial Building when construction started there. Alas, this report cannot be substantiated – anyway, it took years to complete that building (a story in itself). So the original Honor Roll seems to have vanished from history.

For many years, people have been asking just where that memorial could possibly have gone. There are those who believe it's wasting away in someone's old barn but, unfortunately, the Cedar Fire destroyed most of those in 2003. The sad truth is the monument is probably buried in some old landfill.

LHS has a few good photos of the original Honor Roll, with the names very legible, so a reproduction is not out of the question. Where to put it and who might fund it is a valid question that will need to be answered if such a project is undertaken. In the meantime, you can check some of our veterans engraved in the granite block below the flag pole at the Lakeside VFW.

FROM THE ARCHIVES: LAKESIDE FEED STORE

The original Lakeside Feed Store was located at Laurel Street and Maine Avenue (the current site of Eastbound Bar & Grill). The feed store was destroyed by fire in 1938. Manager Ernie Nelson moved to a new location, mid-block between Laurel and Lakeshore, on the east side. In 1947, Harold Bacon erected a new building at Maine and Parkside and Nelson moved his business there (photo above). The Railway Express was also located in this building. The building still stands and is the home of the Garage Door and Gate Store. (From the "Legends of Lakeside," 1986.)
