## **AUTHOR TALK** WITH GERALD HENIG

Triangle, The Fire that Transformed Industrial America

<u>Saturday, November 1</u> <u> 12:00 PM - 3:00 PM</u>

ON March 25, 1911, a cataclysmic fire swept through the Triangle Shirtwaist Factory. One hundred and forty-six employees perished, most of whom were Jewish and Italian immigrant women and girls. Many of the issues that the Triangle fire raised remain in the forefront today: immigration, women's rights, the role of organized labor, and government regulation. Professor Gerald Henig will describe the circumstances leading to this horrific tragedy, and explain why it happened, who was responsible, and its consequences.

JOIN us for stories, songs, and movement geared for ages 0-3 (older siblings welcome). Children must be accompanied by a parent or caregiver.



WE provide a wide variety of art and craft supplies, teens and tweens provide their imaginations. Come make something!


