#### Series: F.A.I.T.H. that Works! Supporting a Culture of Christian Vitality October 2023 Series

In this series we will explore the importance of supporting, celebrating, and developing a culture of Christian vitality. Research shows that vital congregations have a healthy culture that supports the church's mission and vision. We will explore our culture (both what we celebrate being, and what we seek to develop) in an effort to continue to grow as disciples of Jesus Christ at UMCWFB. F.A.I.T.H. is an acronym for the five different values that can guide our faith to work...work for God, work for others and work for ourselves.

#### Sunday, October 8 Title: Fun-Loving

We begin this series by exploring the importance of being a value driven culture. Why are values Important, and what role do they play in how we live together in Christian community and how we care for the world around us? Is fun-loving really a biblical Christian value?



#### Sunday, October 15 Title: Action Oriented

We value faith in action. It is that simple. We want to be a witness of God's activity in our life. Faith is not a noun, but a verb. Let's explore what that means for us in light of God's Word.

#### Sunday, October 22 Title: In the Moment for Christ; In the Power of the Holy Spirit

We celebrate God's grace and love in the moment, because in the moment is where life happens...no more being caught in the past or simply longing for the future, but in thanking God for the blessing of living in the moment.

#### Sunday, October 29 Title: Thankful Spirit

A vital value for a healthy church culture rests in our ability to be thankful. Not easy to do when life gets tough, but it is a disposition to carry us through the hard times and live to the fullest in the moment. Current research shows the power of a thankful spirit for not only a community's health, but personal health as well.

#### Sunday, November 5 Title: Hospitable to Others

Hospitality can be defined as "the quality or disposition of receiving and treating guests and strangers in a warm, friendly, generous way." In the New Testament, the Greek word translated "hospitality" literally means "love of strangers." Hospitality is a virtue that is both commanded and commended throughout Scripture. This is also All Saints' Day Sunday, where we will honor those loved ones who have passed away.






## Welcome

#### Mission of the Month/Loose Change Offering This month your donations go to United Methodist Children's Services, Inc. (UMCS)

Founded in 1962, United Methodist Children's Services of WI (UMCS) found its home in Milwaukee's Washington Park neighborhood in the early 1990s. For more than 30 years UMCS has served the housing, supportive service, and community needs of this vibrant and



beautiful neighborhood. As an anchor institution of the neighborhood, they pride themselves on connecting individuals and families with resources to meet their basic needs so that they can focus on their goals for the future. Specifically they provide child care through their "Growing Tree Children's Center," have a food bank that is open twice weekly, and have provided housing for 72 families.

Their community engagement is so broad that they have many needs for volunteers. This includes needing volunteers to help out in their food center on Mondays and Wednesdays in 2-hour shifts from noon to 4 p.m. During these hours they welcome volunteers to bring meals, snacks, and juices for the clients to enjoy while shopping. Larger groups can be scheduled to work in their indoor facility or around the grounds painting, cleaning up, and landscaping. During the year they host

## Notes from the Board

On September 19, the Accountable Leadership Board met for the regular monthly meeting. In attendance were ALB members Don Behrens, Nancy Anderson, Craig Walker, Jeff McClellan, Tom Van Cleave, Chelsea Montague, Samantha Gundrum, as well as Pastor Gary Holmes, Nell Nash, Jenny Fisher, Laurie Jeffery, Roger Stafford, Mary Paull, Roanne Barnes, Beth Groble and Dick Steinmetz.

#### **Opening Prayer and Consent Agenda**

Nancy opened the meeting with a prayer and a moving testimonial on her faith journey. Jeff has volunteered to provide the prayer/testimonial for October's meeting.

ALB approved the August meeting minutes and Trustees report by consent.

#### **Devotion and Pastor's Report**

Pastor Gary warmed up the group with two questions: Who's the most famous person you've ever met/how? And what would the title of your autobiography be? The answers led to a discussion around leadership and the qualities we look for in a leader. Jesus has been described as the most influential leader ever. From John 14:7 *If you really know me, you will know my father as well. From now on, you do know him and have seen him.* 

Pastor Gary reported that he has continued to feel the affirmation and support from the congregation. He is leading his staff and lay leaders on seven foundational areas of church systems as referenced in a book entitled *Building Worship Bridges*.

Church staff is looking for continued ways to celebrate noting that we will have one service on the **Sunday**, **November 19** prior to Thanksgiving so that we can all worship together, followed by a celebration with pie. Jenny is looking for someone to lead that event. In addition, there will be one worship service on the mornings of **December 24 and December 31**.

#### **Mission Statement and Core Values / Leadership Team Actions**

The Leadership Discernment team will reconvene on October 14 to link the identified actions to behaviors that match up with our vision to Love God, Care for each other, and Serve in the world. There will be a rollout and communication to the congregation of the Spiritual Journey Framework in the fall around the season of Lent.

#### **SPRT Updates**

Don noted that several members of SPRT will be leaving after serving their 3-year term and there is a need for new members. Jeff has recently been added to the team.

If you have an interest in serving on the SPRT, please reach out to Don Behrens.

Frankie Sanchez has been contracted to provide meals for Wednesday Night Faith, Food, and Friendship. A volunteer is doing the food ordering and shopping for the meal programs. In celebration, the first night of the Faith, Food, and Friendship meal program was a roaring success with over 100+ attendees. It was noted that good things happen when we all work together.



#### **Quarterly Fall All-Church Meeting**

After discussion, it was agreed to hold a Fall All-Church Meeting. Please see the announcement forthcoming on a date in November and opportunities for the congregation to provide suggestions for topics to be included in the agenda.

#### **Financial Report**

Based on August Operating Financials through period two, we are off to a good start to the year. A key driver was pledge contributions where some members have paid their pledge for the full year that resulted in a favorable year-to-date budget position of \$61,807.

Two ministries were asked to present to help the ALB understand how their objective(s) fit into the mission statement of Love God, Care for Each Other, and Serve in the World.

#### **Foundation and Memorials**

Roanne Barnes presented an overview of the different funds encompassing the \$2 million endowment: A Common fund; a Maintenance fund; the Huse fund (designated for youth); the Robertson fund (designated for music); the Siegel fund (designated for hospitality); and the Sharratt fund (designated for UMCOR). Disbursements follow a formula; for 2023 it is approximately \$52,000 that is available. Examples of granted requests include Rally Day, new card tables, WNL kids' meals, Believe Again, supplies for an outdoor stable, and worship livestreaming. The committee is open to proposals for items not in the church budget. To request funds, send a grant request to the team including information like purpose, amount requested, how the rest of the expense will be funded.

#### Lydia's Treasure

Mary Paull provided a brief history of its beginning in 1990 on a cart supporting the fair trade market program and moved to its current location from the Narthex expansion in 1999. Because of the interest of fair-trade products, Lydia's expanded their offering to include Thistle Farms products, artist designed cards, Hughes' chocolates, and gently-used products. Lydia's first disbursement was in 2016 supporting eight different missions as well as a tithe to the UMCWFB operating budget. Since Lydia's first year, 26 different missions and ministries, predominantly in Milwaukee, have received over \$61,000. Lydia's team consists of 14 volunteers to help maintain the appearance and inventory and "woman" the shop during set hours as well as special occasions.

#### **Closing Prayer and Plans for Next Meeting**

Tom closed the meeting with a prayer.

Our next meeting will be held on **Tuesday**, **October 17** with the Closed Session beginning at 6:00 p.m. in the Wesley Room for ALB members, and the General Session will begin around 6:30 p.m. where all are welcome. A key event with a missionary is planned that requires a change in our normal starting times. A ZOOM option will be provided.
