




**CARL R. BUTLER INDIVIDUAL  
ARTIST AWARDS**



## OVERVIEW

The Frederick Arts Council is recognizing artists with the Carl R. Butler individual artist grants. These awards honor, support and strengthen artists in the Frederick area. Individual Artist Awards will consist of one winner in each of the following disciplines this year: painting/drawing, music, and creative writing. In addition, one visual artist will win a placement at the Foundation de La Napoule artist in residency in the South of France.

### **Applications are available to artists in the following disciplines:**

- Painting/Drawing
- Music
- Creative writing

Three artists will be awarded a grant of \$2,000 and one additional visual arts winner will be awarded a one-month residency to the La Napoule Art Foundation from October 21 to November 21, 2019, for a total of four awardees. Applications will be made in SlideRoom and all Visual Arts applicants will indicate on their application if they want to be considered for the Artist in Residency award.

### **Who May Apply:**


Artists may apply for an Individual Artist Award if they meet the following eligibility requirements:

- Artist must be a full-time Frederick County resident
- Artist must have demonstrable experience creating artwork
- Artist must currently be producing artwork

The Individual Artist Award will be announced at a public celebration held June 27, 2019. 
## FOUNDATION DE LA NAPOULE ARTIST IN RESIDENCY

## ABOUT CARL R. BUTLER

The Frederick Arts Council's Individual Artist Awards honor the memory of beloved local artist Carl R. Butler (1962-2018), son of Madeleine and Randolph Butler. Mr. Butler was born in France and at an early age began showing an affinity for art, while growing up in a military family in France, Germany, and California. In 1976, Mr. Butler attended Brunswick High School, where he participated in the Gifted and Talented Program. Upon graduating, Mr. Butler attended the Maryland Institute College of Art in Baltimore, Maryland. Mr. Butler's works were luminous and had strong, spiritual overtones. In 1997, he was commissioned by the Curator of the Brunswick Museum to portray African Americans working on the railroad, of which he did in honor of his Grandfather, George W. Butler. Mr. Butler was a member of the Frederick Arts Council, Frederick County Art Association and the Delaplaine Visual Arts Center, and his work and spirit is sorely missed.
