AHMA East Texas Scholarship Foundation 2023 Education Scholarship Application Information

AHMA East Texas

Affordable Housing Management Association of East Texas (AHMA-East Texas) is a non-profit educational organization representing owners and managers of affordable housing and federally assisted, multi-unit housing communities in the East Texas area. AHMA East Texas provides training programs for management staff and works with governmental agencies to assist in compliance with housing regulations.

The Scholarships

AHMA East Texas Scholarship Foundation will award educational scholarships to qualified applicants as determined by the Scholarship Eligibility requirements listed below. Scholarships are to be used for post-secondary education at accredited colleges, universities or post-high school vocational schools.

Scholarship Goals

These scholarships are intended to provide educational and career opportunities to deserving individuals living in affordable housing units or to those working in the affordable housing industry and their family members. Considering the many challenges facing potential scholarship applicants, it is the goal of AHMA East Texas Scholarship Foundation to award scholarships based on an applicant's demonstrated qualities of scholarship, motivation, character, and leadership.

Scholarship Funding and Use

Scholarships to academic colleges or universities are funded and must be used during the upcoming academic year Fall, 2023 through Spring, 2023. Scholarships for technical or vocational institutions will be funded for the next class session following the award date. Scholarships may be used for tuition, fees, and books. Funds are disbursed to only ONE educational institution to be applied to an approved educational expense. Funds are not disbursed directly to scholarship recipients AND UNUSED FUNDS MUST BE USED WITHIN the following 24-month period.

Scholarship Eligibility

Each scholarship applicant must qualify in one of the following categories:

- 1. A qualified resident of an AHMA East Texas member community
- 2. **An employee (or immediate family member) of an AHMA East Texas member.** Membership must be in good standing as of the date of the scholarship application. The immediate family is defined as the spouse, dependent child, or legal ward of the AHMA Member Employee.

Applicants must submit a **complete** AHMA East Texas 2023 Scholarship Application along with providing the required letters of recommendation and other documents as indicated in the application. <u>Additionally, you must obtain certification of your eligibility from your member Community or member Managing Agent. The Certification of Eligibility is part of the application and is located at the bottom of page 3 of this application packet.</u>

It is very important that applicants follow all instructions contained in the application form.

Important Dates

- **May 10, 2023** Completed application materials must be received by AHMA East Texas (either via email or physical copy). An email confirmation will be sent confirming receipt.
- June 15, 2023 Scholarship awards announced. Funding dates will be specified in each individual award. Final scholarship awards are contingent upon the recipient's acceptance at an accredited educational institution prior to the actual funding date. If a recipient has not been accepted at an accredited educational institution, the scholarship will be revoked.

Please Read Carefully

Scholarship Application Evaluation

All applications are screened administratively for eligibility and completeness. **Incomplete or ineligible applications will not be processed.** Screened applications are then forwarded to the AHMA East Texas Scholarship Committee. *A critical part of the scholarship evaluation process is the applicant's ability to follow the application instructions and guidelines. Please double-check your application and be sure all necessary elements are completed and that all documentation is submitted in one package and that nothing is stapled. Include all application pages in the correct order.*

Scholarship Eligibility: Each scholarship applicant must qualify in one of the following categories:

- 1. A qualified resident of an AHMA East Texas member community.
- 2. An employee (or immediate family member) of an AHMA East Texas member.
- 3. Membership must be in good standing as of the date of the scholarship application.
- 4. The immediate family is defined as the spouse, dependent child, or legal ward of the AHMA Member Employee.

Each applicant must submit a complete AHMA East Texas **2023** Scholarship Application Form with the required letters of recommendation attached. <u>Additionally, you must obtain the member Community or member Management Agent certification of your eligibility</u>. The Certification of Eligibility is part of the application and is located at the bottom of page of the application packet. **It is very important that applicants follow all instructions contained in the application packet (8 pages).**

All members of the AHMA East Texas Scholarship Committee individually review and score all applications based on the criteria discussed below. Points are assigned for each area and totaled for each applicant. Applicants are then preliminarily ranked by numerical score. The Scholarship Committee, as a group, makes the final selections based on discussion and rescoring of the top applications to ensure consistency of evaluation and eliminate ties. With respect to any criteria or requirements, all applicants are treated equally.

Maximum total score is 100

Likelihood of Acceptance at an Accredited Institution - Maximum 10 points.

Evaluation of the applicant's graduation records, GED certificate, transcripts, grade point average, work history related to the desired course or study or school, etc. – or evidence that the applicant has already been accepted at an accredited institution (in which case the maximum ten points will be awarded).

2. Community Service/Volunteerism, Extracurricular, Employment - Maximum 30 points.

Quality of the applicant's overall activities in the above areas: These areas are not evaluated separately because individual circumstances may or may not have permitted activity in one or another. For instance, outstanding volunteer work may outweigh a lack of employment history – or vice versa.

3. Essav – Maximum 30 points

Evaluation for clarity, and whether they adequately express the applicant's educational and career goals, reasons for wanting a scholarship, and any special circumstances. The essay should not exceed one page and should be legible and neat.

4. Letters of Recommendation – 15 points maximum each (total 30 points)

Letters must be attached to the application and should discuss the applicant's demonstrated qualities of character, initiative, honesty, achievement, and leadership. Letters must be written by qualified adults such as teachers, employers, supervisors, religious leaders, or others who can legitimately attest to the above qualities. Letters may not be from parties related to the applicant. Letters must be typed or written legibly, must be dated within the last six months, must be signed and must contain the address and contact telephone number of the signer. If from an organization, it must be on their Letterhead. **Only two letters may be included in the application.**

Please be advised that your essay is a critical part of the selection process, counting for 30 of the 100 possible points.

Letters of Recommendation

Attach two current letters of recommendation (dated within 6 months of application date). Letters should discuss the applicant's demonstrated qualities of character, initiative, honesty, achievement, and leadership. Letters must be written by qualified adults such as teachers, employers, supervisors, religious leaders, or others who can legitimately attest to the above qualities. Letters may not be from parties related to the applicant. Letters must be typed or written legibly, must be dated within the last six months, must be signed and must contain the address and contact telephone number of the signer. If from an organization, it must be on their Letterhead. No points will be awarded if instructions are not followed including undated letters, unsigned letters, letters missing contact information, etc. Please be advised the recommendation letters are a critical part of the selection process.

Note:

To prevent loss of important information or delay in processing, all additional documents (transcripts, certificates, essay, and letters of recommendation) MUST be enclosed with your application and submitted to AHMA East Texas in one package. Incomplete submissions will be disqualified. PLEASE <u>DO NOT</u> USE STAPLES IF MAILING.
