From the Rev. Luke Selles:

Last week, the St. Martin's and St. Paul's campuses were full of children for Vacation Bible School in a collaboration between St. Timothy's, Roxborough, St. Paul's, Chestnut Hill, and St. Martin's. Our theme this year was "Come Grow with Us," as we dove deep into the Parable of the Sower through storytelling, creative activities, and music-making.

Throughout the week, myself and the Reverend Meghan Mazur, Rector of St. Tim's, Roxborough, and the Reverend Madeleine Harris-Lerew, Assistant Rector of St. Paul's, as well as many other volunteer leaders and teachers, shared our Christian belief that God's creation is a gift we all share: we all live in it together and depend on it together. Caring for it—together—is both a good work and collective act of faith.

Our week was packed with activities and learning. We planted seeds.

We tie-dyed t-shirts. We created our own instruments from found materials.

We were introduced to the organ, handbells, and the bells in the bell tower.

On Friday, our final day, we learned about living – and thriving – together in community. We learned about the Paw Paw, a native tree, and how it is intertwined with the life of the Zebra Swallowtail, a native butterfly, and with deer and other creatures, which spread its seeds. We enjoyed slip n' slides and sprinklers. We closed the week with a special celebration for families, as the children sang two songs that they learned and we gathered for ice cream and connection.

It was a full week – a week of challenges, dangerous heat, and many last minute adaptations. But in spite of, or perhaps because of these challenges, we planted seeds of God's love, we put down roots, and we grew – by the end of the week, we were no longer members of three parishes: we were one community of God. And it was the children leading the way as they grew in community with each other and in confidence within themselves.
