Now is the time to pay the initial deposit of \$500.00. You should address the check to Grace Church with "Holy Land Trip Deposit" in the memo line. Please forward your deposit to our Financial Secretary, Ms. Sandra Joseph and she will credit your account accordingly. Please try to have all deposits in no later than Monday, September 30<sup>th</sup>.
