

### **A. Preparedness for an Active Assailant in the Workplace and Community**

As many of you have certainly noted, our society is experiencing an increase in active assailant events. Unfortunately, we in Dane County are not immune to such disturbing incidents. Many community leaders, as well as citizens, are concerned about what they can or should do when confronted with these situations. It is important to know that oftentimes police response time may not be quick enough to intervene before significant injury or death occurs. It is imperative to have options in your plan so survive, not only in the workplace, but also in your life. Topics during this breakout will include lessons learned from previous active assailant events, resources, prevention information, rendering aid, options-based training (RUN HIDE FIGHT), and potential early warning signs to be cognizant of. Through this initiative, we feel citizens will be empowered to take action and have the tools and action plans to survive.

**B. Scams and Frauds: What to know and how to protect yourself***Detective Troy Pagenkopf*

This presentation will involve discussion on several known scams including some helpful tips on how to identify these fraudulent schemes in an effort to reduce your falling victim to them.

Workshops: Breakout #2**A. Human Trafficking – Recognizing and Reporting the Signs***Detective Todd Dosher*

Human Trafficking is a statewide issue that effects urban and rural populations throughout Wisconsin. A modern version of slavery, human trafficking often goes unnoticed and unreported. Traffickers seek out the vulnerable and recruit through force, fraud and coercion. During this presentation we’ll define human trafficking, explain risk factors and talk about awareness issues. The program will end with discussion on how we can help victims leave “the life.”

**B. Travel Safety***Janet Fowler, Travel Sales Development Specialist, AAA Wisconsin*

Participants will learn how to stay healthy while traveling, about travel scams, street crimes and how to avoid them, trip insurance, tours vs travel on your own, hotel alternatives, auto readiness for car trips, local transportation alternatives, cruise health and safety, and what to do if I get sick away from home.

**C. Current Drug Trends***Detective Heidi Gardner*

This session will update attendees with current drug trends seen across the country. Medications being stolen or sold is one of the big things that leads to drug abuse. This session will address some different ways to keep your medications safe. Another topic covered will be senior drug abuse and signs to look for.

**A. Addressing Loneliness & Social Isolation in Later Adulthood***Professor Tracy Schroepfer, PhD, MSW*

In 2017, about 28% (13.8 million) of elders lived alone, with more women living alone (34%) than men (20%), and these numbers only increase with advanced age (AOA, 2018). Issues that can arise for these elders are isolation and loneliness, which have shown to result in poorer physical and mental health, as well as an increased risk of early mortality. This workshop will provide information on this issue, as well as strategies that can be utilized to maintain and increase social connections for these elders.


