Patient Case Scenario #1

Patient from New York is on vacation in Florida for two weeks, and needs a refill of PrEP.

- Last labs were 3-4 months ago
- Last labs were 6-7 months ago



Patient Case Scenario #2

Patient “temporarily re-located” to Maine, has now been there for 6 months, and is overdue for labs which clinical practice guidelines require in order to get a refill on prescriptions.



Patient Case Scenario #3

Patient moved to Pennsylvania last year for a truck driving job. She is driving her truck in New Mexico when her New York State based provider calls her to conduct a video visit and follow up on some recent labs which include positive STD results. She says she is fine to proceed but won't look at the screen.



Patient Case Scenario #4

Patient has extended what was supposed to be a temporary leave from New York to indefinitely. After 12 months, the patient doesn't have a time frame for coming back to the State, but still wants to receive care with her NYS provider.

At the video visit 3 months ago, patient was given 3 appropriate local options for care.



Patient Case Scenario #5

An undocumented, uninsured patient in New York who has PrEP AP (covered by ADAP) moved permanently to Texas 2 months ago.

How should a New York State-based provider follow up with labs and visits, knowing that these services will not get reimbursed? Or will they?
