Pastor's Page



My car is pretty dirty. I mean...really dirty.

Part of the reason is that I don't want to spend \$12 on the carwash. And I just forget to do it. It's just not a priority for me.

Another reason is that now it's become a "thing", you know what I mean? It's kind of a source of strange pride that I can easily find my car in the parking lot of any store because of how it looks. It's the dirty one...the really dirty one.

I sincerely can't remember the last time I've washed it.

I think of that dirty car though and I can't help but connect it with the season of Lent.

Lent is a time of the church year where we remember that we are dirty. We begin by having ashes put on our foreheads reminding us that we are "dust". We are dirt. And someday we will return to the dirt. And yet we have this time of the church year to remember that even though we are dirty...Even though all of us have problems and darkness and "dirt" about us, Jesus still gave his life for us on the cross. That's why we make that mark on our foreheads with a cross.

We are dirty, much like my car. But we have been made clean by the gift of Jesus and his life for us. Lent is my favorite time of year because I am reminded that even though I am a sinner...Even though I am often selfish and full of myself and my own pride and agendas and needs...Jesus still loves me.

Even though I am dirty, Jesus still washes me and makes me his own. He does so with the waters and his word when we are named and claimed in baptism. He does so when we eat the bread and drink the wine and we are reminded of the body and blood. He does so when I see the needs of others around me and I respond out of my blessedness. He does so in countless ways and opportunities in our lives to help us to see that even though we are dirty, we are his...always.

I will probably wash my car...probably... :)

I will probably do so as a gentle reminder that I have been made clean too.

Made clean by the actions of Jesus who loves me...who loves you...who gave his life on the tree so that when the tomb was found empty, we too might have new life again and again.

May you remember and observe this Lent in a similar way.

May you remember that you are named and claimed and made clean and washed by Him.

And may you share that truth wherever you are and with those you meet along the way.

Saturday, April 1st from 9 to noon in the donut room.

We will need helpers of all kinds (cutting, ironing, sewing, serging, assembling), so all are welcome. This makes a great community service event for middle and high school students as well! If you have one, please bring your sewing machine or serger. Otherwise just bring yourself. Donations are also welcome--see the list below for suggested items, which can be left on the Full Circle table in the donut room. (See below for information on the organization.)

Title Town Days for Girls is a group of women in the Green Bay area who have joined forces to help girls and women around the world. We are part of Days for Girls International, visit www.daysforgirls.org for more details.

Did you know 40% of menstruating females in the world have no products to use for their monthly period? In some countries, if they have access to product and can afford them, they may cause cancer and are told it is not good to use them.

FULL CIRCLE

We felt we could help make a difference to many females in the world. We want to keep girls in school and women at their jobs.

Our Chapter began in 2010 making personal hygiene kits to send around the world. Each kit has about \$25 of materials, plus 3 hours of time to make and assemble. Each completed kit contains: 1 drawstring bag, 1 washcloth, 1 small soap, 1 instruction sheet, 1 transport pouch, 2 shields and 8 liners. In Nov '22 we reached a milestone of packing kit #10,000. What a great feeling.

We typically have at least one workday a month. Our workday location depends on the group hosting our chapter. All of our upcoming workday events are listed on our Facebook group page.

Ways to help Title Town Days for Girls

- 1) Items to donate:
 - a. Dark, busy patterned cotton fabric
 - b. Dark busy patterned flannel fabric
 - c. Lightweight washcloths
 - d. Small hotel soap
 - e. Thread (both serger and regular)
 - f. Panties (Girls sizes 12-18, Women's-S, M, L, XL)
- 2) Things to do:
 - a. Come to our work days (we have tasks for all skill levels, if you come, we'll keep you busy)
 - b. Sew at home (liners, drawstring bags and pouches)
- 3) Monetary donations
100% for kit materials, as we are 100% volunteer.

We buy PUL (waterproof barrier for \$5/yd through Days for Girls). We can buy flannel online from JoAnn_Fabric for \$3/yd.

If you know anyone cleaning out their fabric stash, we will gratefully accept fabric and thread. Lighter colored fabric is dyed darker. If we can't use it for the kits, we make large bags to help with transporting the completed kits. OR we pass it on to other groups for their projects.

Lutheran Disaster Response

Lutheran Disaster Response shares God's hope, healing and renewal with people whose lives have been disrupted by disasters in the United States and around the world. When the dust settles and the headlines change, we stay to provide ongoing assistance to those in need.

Middle East Crisis

The situation:

On Feb. 6 two powerful earthquakes hit Türkiye and significantly impacted neighboring Syria. The first was a magnitude 7.8 earthquake in south central Türkiye, followed hours later by a magnitude 7.5 quake in the southeastern part of the country. The two quakes have devastated Türkiye and Syria, collapsing thousands of buildings and damaging infrastructure. Thousands of people have been killed, thousands more have been injured, yet search-and-rescue efforts are only in the early stages. A cold and snowy weather system now moving through the region complicates response efforts.

Our response:

Lutheran Disaster Response is committed to supporting ACT Alliance and other partners in responding to these earthquakes. Mere hours after the earthquakes hit, ACT Alliance member organizations began distributing emergency supplies, including medicines, bedding and other relief items. A comprehensive response will be coordinated as the full extent of the impact becomes clearer.

Lutheran Disaster Response has been active in this region for several years, partnering with ACT Alliance, the Lutheran World Federation and the Middle East Council of Churches to accompany Syrian refugees with food, water, shelter, health services and sanitation support. The epicenter of one earthquake lies near Turkish provinces that host hundreds of thousands of Syrian refugees, which will only exacerbate the refugee crisis in the region.

What you can do:

Pray—Please pray for people in Türkiye and Syria who have been impacted by the earthquakes. May God's healing presence give them peace and hope in their time of need.

Give—Your gifts designated for “[Middle East Crisis](#)” will be used entirely (100%) to provide long-lasting support for those whose lives have been impacted by disasters in the region.

Did you know??

Spring cleaning is coming soon! Study after study has proven that cleaning/organizing your environment boosts your mood, decreases anxiety, and promotes an overall better lifestyle. As you begin the ever-daunting, but necessary process of sorting through piles and cleaning all that stuff you were "always going to get to", keep in mind that we collect a number of items for local recycling.

- **Old newspapers** are collected in the container next to the garage (tan with green lid), and the collection supports our daycare.
- **Empty ink cartridges**—Deb turns them in to get credit for office supplies.
- **Recent magazines** (not more than a year old)
- **Eye glasses** for the Lion's Club
 - These items are all collected in bins by the old pastors' offices.
- We also have grocery carts in each entry way for **food donations** to support local pantries.



Good news flags

Use batik, a unique fabric-dying method, to create flags celebrating the good news of Christ's resurrection.



What you need:

- Colored chalk
- White linen fabric
- Washable gel glue
- Acrylic craft paint
- Textile medium
- Paintbrushes

What you do:

- Cut fabric to the desired size and shape. Set it on a flat, protected surface. With chalk, lightly sketch an Easter design or message.
- Completely cover the chalk lines with gel glue. Let dry.
- Mix equal parts paint and textile medium. Paint the flag with that mixture, which makes paint permanent. Let dry.
- Soak the dried fabric in warm water a few minutes. Then gently peel away the glue to reveal the unpainted areas. Lay flat to dry.
- Hang the flags and celebrate!
