Peace & Greetings,

As you may know, Pope Francis completed today an historic 4-day Apostolic Visit to Iraq, the first ever papal trip to this overwhelmingly Muslim country. He visited Erbil, Iraq celebrating Mass in the Franso Hariri Stadium. This has special significance for St. Paul since for the last few years our school has been praying in particular for the persecuted Christians in Ankawa, Erbil.

Upon his arrival in Baghdad, Pope Francis stated, “I come as a pilgrim, as a penitent pilgrim to implore forgiveness and reconciliation from the Lord after years of war and terrorism … to ask God for the consolation of hearts and healing of wounds.” Prior to his trip Pope Francis indicated, “We must work to ensure that the Christian presence in these lands continue to be what it has always been: a sign of peace, progress, development and reconciliation between peoples.” The Pope called for respect for all religions and an end to violence and extremism.

He found in the temple area those who sold oxen, sheep, and doves, as well as the money-changers seated there. He made a whip out of cords and drove them all out of the temple area, with the sheep and oxen, and spilled the coins of the money-changers and overturned their tables, and to those who sold doves he said, “Take these out of here, and stop making my Father’s house a marketplace.” His disciples recalled the words of scripture, “Zeal for your house will consume me.” (John 2:12-14)

Jesus is righteously angry about how the temple of the Lord, a sacred space, has been turned into a place of commerce and financial exchange. We as the Church must always be on guard that our churches and parishes do not become places of exclusivity where only the so called “holy people” are allowed to partake. Rather, our parishes, our communities should be inclusive, accepting, welcoming to all. Most importantly, they should be places where divine grace is infused into our souls for sanctification.

Pope Francis has been in Iraq this week visiting the Catholic people there and praying for unity and peace in a divided area of the world. The Holy Father remarked that love is our strength. Indeed, the love of Jesus Christ is always our strength, our courage, and our hope.

Let us pray,

O God, author of every mercy and of all goodness, who in fasting, prayer and almsgiving have shown us a remedy for sin, look graciously on this confession of our lowliness, that we, who are bowed down by our conscious, may always be lifted up by your mercy. Through our Lord, Jesus Christ, your Son, who lives and reigns with you in the unity of the Holy Spirit, one God, for ever and ever. Amen.



TRAVEL GUIDELINES

Recently, I've had some questions regarding returning to St. Paul following out-of-state travel. While the guidelines are always subject to change and Governor Lamont indicated last Thursday the possibility of loosening travel restrictions, these are the BBHD policies we are currently following when traveling to states other than New Jersey, New York and Rhode Island for more than a 24-hour period:

Three options:

- 1) The first option – test 72 hours prior to arrival back to CT. A negative test would allow you to return to school.
- 2) The second option – test when you return to CT. Quarantine until you get your test results. You may get a rapid test (only in travel circumstances; all other situations require a PCR test). A negative test allows you to be out of quarantine and return to school.
- 3) If you do not want to test – you must stay in quarantine for 10 days from the day you arrive back in CT.

If anyone test positive, this would all change. I will continue to communicate any policy changes.

Don't forget to "spring ahead" next Sunday, March 14 as we shift to Daylight Savings Time.
