ST. PAUL WINTER SPORTS – FAN POLICY

Consistent with the fall season, we will begin the season with **NO FANS** (recommendation of the CIAC although leaving the final decision to the respective leagues) allowed at our home games. The NVL has established a league policy restricting visiting fans from any schools. The focus of our Athletic Department will be managing COVID-19 mitigation protocols for St. Paul and visiting student athletes in an effort to create the safest possible environment. After the first few games, we will re-evaluate our fan policy and determine if it is prudent to allow family members to attend home games on a limited basis.
