### REMOTE LEARNING – IMPORTANT STUDENT HANDBOOK REMINDERS

One last time this week, let me remind students electing to attend school remotely during COVID-19 that they are required to conform to all expectations for proper student behavior as set forth in the 2020-2021 St. Paul Student Handbook. We are encouraging consistent compliance and cooperation.

- Students must have their video feed on at all times in Zoom and their face must be completely visible on camera unless they have sought and received permission from their teacher to leave the screen.
- Students may choose to leave their Zoom audio on mute, but must unmute themselves to answer a teacher's question, respond to a comment in class or ask a question.
- Students are expected to be in St. Paul uniform during all Zoom sessions. Students are encouraged to find a quiet setting in their home to attend class.
- Regular attendance is a necessity for achievement in school. Excessive absence, indicating a lack
  of interest and application, is a hindrance to the learning process and will not be tolerated. For
  the purposes of official school attendance, each time a remote learner is absent from school,
  a parent <u>must</u> notify the Main Office between 7:00 a.m. and 9:00 a.m. to explain the nature
  of the student's absence.
- To be recorded as present for a school day, a remote learner must arrive on time to the Zoom session for their homeroom/A period as well as attend at a minimum an additional two full academic class sessions. Attendance in each Zoom class will be taken, and a student who misses more than 15 remote learning classes, will be in danger of not receiving credit for that course.

A reminder that in-person learners are required to take all assessments in-person and not over Zoom. If absent on the day of an assessment, students should be prepared to take their quiz/test on the day they return to school.

# PERRY VIRTUAL EXPERIENCE

We're very excited to announce upcoming sessions of the Perry Virtual Experience in **March 2021**. The Perry Virtual Experience is a free, 2.5-hour, interactive online experience for high school and college-aged women who are interested in pursuing careers in orthopedic surgery and engineering. Participants will hear from women leaders in these fields and dive into online orthopedic simulations and biomechanics experiments. ### SAT PREP CLASS - CLASS OF 2022

A reminder that the Lentz & Lentz SAT Prep course will be offered this March/April at St. Paul in preparation for the May 8 SAT. Students have a choice of taking the course in-person at St. Paul or virtually with live interactive classes hosted through Zoom. In-person classes begin Saturday, March 6 from 9:30 am – 12:30 pm and virtual classes begin the week of March 14.

The cost of the program is \$385 for twenty-four hours of preparation. A minimum of 10 students is needed to offer the in-person option. If there are not enough students to offer the in-person option, all classes will be conducted virtually.

The verbal part consists of reading comprehension, vocabulary, speed-reading techniques, grammatical skills, optional essay writing, all applicable to the SAT. The mathematical part covers a myriad of problems, including: arithmetical skills, advanced algebra, basic geometry, functions, trigonometry, exponents and modern mathematic concepts.

### ST. PAUL WINTER SPORTS – FAN POLICY UPDATE

A reminder that the NVL has established a league policy restricting fan attendance for visiting schools. Visit the Athletic Section of the school website for broadcast information on away basketball games.

While the focus of the St. Paul athletic department continues to be managing COVID-19 mitigation protocols for the safety of all the student-athletes and coaches, starting this Monday, February 22 we will phase-in fan attendance allowing **two family members per basketball player** at home games. We will evaluate and confirm the next phase regarding attendance of cheerleading parents next week. These decisions are being made in compliance with state and local health department guidelines. All fans will need to sign-in, be temperature checked and hand sanitize upon entrance and required to follow social distancing guidelines (maintaining a distance of 6') in the athletic lobby and bleachers. Once the contest is over, we ask that you leave the gymnasium. We emphasize that you should **NOT** attend any games if you are experiencing any COVID-19 related symptoms.

We also ask that our home fans place an extra emphasis on sportsmanship when cheering at games recognizing the uniqueness of the current situation and that no fans will be present to support the visiting student-athletes.

A reminder that all levels of our home basketball games will continue to be live streamed (and taped for later viewing) via the **NFHS Network**. ## TEAM FALCON FORCE - eCYBERMISSION CONTEST

"Team Falcon Force," a team of four freshmen, Matteus Abastillas, Nicholas Lowell, Angela Ragaini, and Brianna Wood along with Mrs. Clarke, as advisor, are participating in the eCybermission Contest, <a href="https://www.ecybermission.com">https://www.ecybermission.com</a>, as a part of the St. Paul Data Analytics Team. The team meets every Tuesday and Thursday evening over zoom investigating the impact of blue light on the eyes and well-being of young students.

Per a recent conversation with Brianna and Angela, the team had to identify a problem in our community, plan and build a prototype to solve the problem, and then test it out. The team's problem statement is "We want to monitor and reduce the exposure of artificial blue light on the school aged population by developing a safe, affordable, and efficient wearable device. Currently, our prototype plan is to create a sensor that attaches to an artificial blue light filter built into a face shield. This sensor is connected to an Arduino circuit, which is then connected to a breadboard, with LED color coded lights that signify the level of blue light exposure. We plan to have the sensor collect data of the radiation and energy levels to determine the blue light and then furthermore use that information to create the color coded artificial blue light sensing system."

Wow, that's impressive ... good luck!
