POSSIBLE WEATHER DELAYED OPENING MONDAY

There is a possibility of a two-hour delayed school opening tomorrow due to forecasted overnight wintry mix. If this should happen, it will be announced on a Parent Reach robocall and the local television stations. A reminder that out-of-town busing will operate on a 90-minute delayed schedule if there is an announced two-hour delay. From an instructional perspective, A & B Periods will be dropped and Homeroom/C Period would begin at 9:45 am.

IMPORTANT REMINDERS FOR IN-PERSON LEARNING

As COVID-19 cases continue to increase across the country and in our state, please adhere to the following **MANDATORY PRACTICES** to help keep our St. Paul community healthy and safe.

- Every student, faculty and staff member **MUST** submit the mandatory online **BBHD Daily Morning Health Self-Assessment before arriving at school**. Students who do not complete the daily health survey will lose in-school privileges. Remote learners do not need to complete the daily survey.
- **PLEASE REMAIN HOME IF YOU ARE NOT FEELING WELL.** Stay home if you have symptoms associated with COVID-19 including a fever, shortness of breath, muscle aches, sore throat, unexplained loss of taste and smell or a headache. **Do not assume you have a cold, allergies, etc.** You should not return to school until your symptoms have improved or you submit a doctor's note indicating that your symptoms are not COVID-19 related.
- If you, a family member or a "close contact" test positive for COVID-19 you **MUST** stay home from school and notify the St. Paul health room immediately.
- Practice mitigation health strategies (i.e. wear a mask, wash hands, practice physical distancing, etc.) beyond the normal school day (i.e. evenings and weekends) to leave the virus outside our borders.

CLOSE CONTACT QUARANTINE PROTOCOL

- Individuals who are close contacts and reside in the same house as a positive case will still be required to quarantine for 14 days.

As previously announced, the CDC and State of Connecticut have provided the option of a 10 or 7-day quarantine with a negative test on or after day 5 along with other requirements. We have since learned that while the BBHD is offering all three options not every local health district (as determined by where you reside) is offering these early release options due to staffing. Therefore, due to the sheer volume and inconsistency of neighboring health districts, St. Paul will not be offering these reduced quarantine options in the cohorts of students that are identified as close contacts. Depending on COVID-19 conditions, this is subject to review but appears prudent in the short-term.

St. Paul and the BBHD have experienced situations where individuals have initially tested negative then developed symptoms after 7-10 days. Thus, the longer initial quarantine will help to minimize further quarantine exposure.

RETURNING FROM OUT-OF-STATE TRAVEL QUARANTINE PROTOCOL

Effective December 19, 2020, pursuant to Governor Lamont's [Executive Order No. 9S](#), anyone traveling into Connecticut from a state or territory, other than New York, New Jersey, or Rhode Island, or from a country other than the United States, is directed to self-quarantine for a 10-day period from the time of last contact within the identified state or country.

“Given the current high rates of COVID-19 throughout the United States and internationally, Connecticut continues to strongly discourage all nonessential, interstate travel at this time as the risks are too severe,” Governor Lamont said. “Visitors to Connecticut and residents returning from any location beyond the immediate region – including New Jersey, New York, and Rhode Island – should self-quarantine for a period of 10 days in order to reduce the risk of any further spread of this virus.”

The new state travel guidance has lowered the required travel quarantine period from 14 to 10 days. Anyone who travels to a state or country on the state advisory list must quarantine for 10 days. If travelers get a negative test (PCR or Antigen) within 72 hours after returning, they may submit a copy of those results to our health office: Elizabeth McGuire, elizabethmcguire@bristolct.gov or Ann Marie Pahl, apahl@spchs.com for consideration of an early end to their travel quarantine. However, even if you receive a negative COVID-19 test result, you will be required to remain home and reduce non-essential activities for a full seven days after travel before returning to school.
