

BUILD CLINICS

MOBILE CLINICS ON THE MOVE

Five clinics, multiple destinations, and one shared purpose. Students from Texas A&M University come together to build mobile clinics with care and intention, knowing these structures will support patients and strengthen communities far beyond campus.

Dedicated to fallen heroes, these clinics represent service, learning, and lasting impact. With the support of dedicated partners, donors, sponsors, and the Medical Bridges team, two clinics quickly made their way to Chester, Texas and Worcester, Massachusetts, while three more are now being prepared for shipment to Ukraine, Malawi, and Belize. This effort reflects what's possible when engineering meets empathy and collaboration turns local action into global healing.

PARTNERSHIP IN ACTION: EXPANDING PEDIATRIC CARE IN KENYA

A single shipping container helped support the creation of a fully functioning pediatric clinic in Kilifi, Kenya, demonstrating the lasting impact of collaboration. Through the dedication of BUILD students and the partnership of Hope Walks and Clubfoot Care for Kenya, this project is expanding access to life-changing treatment for children and families.
