From 2018 to 2024, we achieved remarkable growth. The total value of shipments increased from \$5,346,766 in 2018 to \$11,932,763 in 2024 – an extraordinary 122% increase over six years. This growth demonstrates the power of collaboration and the efficiency of Medical Bridges' operations.

# 2024 HIGHLIGHTS



Through impactful partnerships, Medical Bridges continues to ensure vital support reaches communities in need in Ghana.

*According to the World Health Organization, Ghana faces a doctor-to-patient ratio of 1:8,000 in rural areas, highlighting the urgent need for our efforts.*

Through the dedicated efforts of Gisèle Ntsoure in partnership with the International Solidarity Association of Women (ONG ASOIF), Medical Bridges shipped essential medical supplies to the University Hospital Center of Libreville (CHUL)

*In Gabon, where there are only 0.3 doctors per 1,000 people, resources like these are critical.*

# 2024 HIGHLIGHTS



Medical Bridges' recent efforts have delivered life-saving medical devices to strengthen ICU, emergency, and surgical care while advancing early breast cancer detection.

*In Ethiopia, where there are only 3 hospital beds per 10,000 people and over 75% of breast cancer cases are diagnosed at late stages, the need for these resources is critical.*

Thanks to HHRD, Medical Bridges shipped more containers to Djibouti. These containers, filled with essential supplies and equipment, are helping healthcare workers treat more patients, reduce wait times, and improve overall health outcomes.

*In Djibouti there are about 18 doctors per 100,000 individuals.*

Since the beginning of the conflict Medical Bridges has shipped over \$17M worth of medical supplies thanks to our dedicated partners.

*In Ukraine, the ongoing conflict has severely impacted the healthcare system, with the World Health Organization recording 2,093 attacks on healthcare facilities from February 2022 to October 2024.*

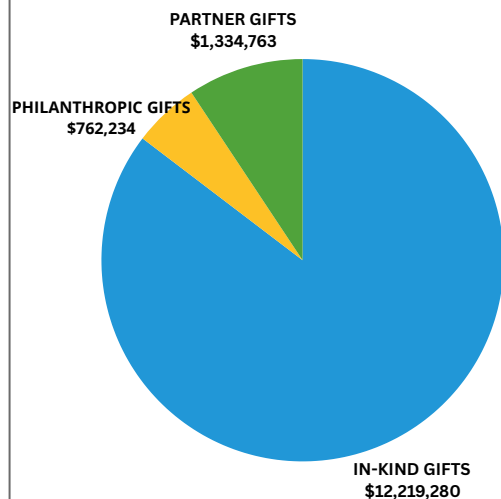

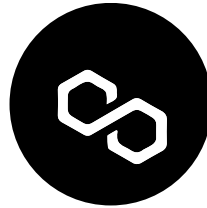

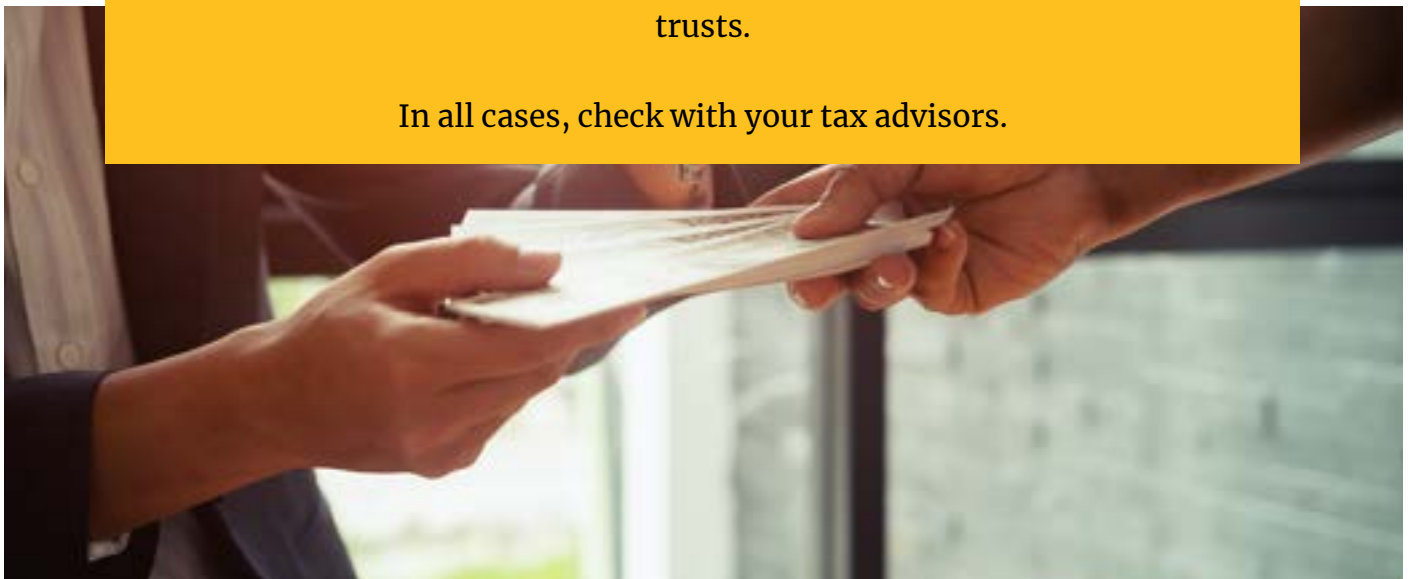
