SHIPMENT TO PAKISTAN

In November, Medical Bridges loaded two containers of lifesaving medical supplies bound for Pakistan through our partnership with Helping Hand for Relief and Development (HHRD).

Together, we're equipping hospitals and clinics with the essential tools they need to care for their communities.

SHIPMENT BIBIANI, GHANA

Medical Bridges loaded a 40-foot container of critical medical equipment and supplies for a Medical Center in Bibiani, Ghana. This shipment will support thousands of patients across the Western North Region.

We were honored to have John Kingsford of The Richmond Foundation join us as we loaded the shipment, marking over a decade of collaboration to expand access to quality healthcare.



GLOBAL HEALTH IMPACT

NEW YORK FUNDRAISING BRINGS LIFESAVING CARE TO GUATEMALA

Thanks to the generosity of our supporters in New York, over 12,000 essential medical items have arrived at the Juan Pablo II Maternal and Child Hospital in Guatemala, supporting emergency care, maternal health, surgery, diagnostics, primary care, infection control, respiratory care, and hospital strengthening.

With an estimated value of \$200,000+, these supplies will help over 19,000 patients receive the care they need. Guatemala is one of three countries benefiting from this initiative.

This is global health in action, made possible by partners, donors, and volunteers who believe in healthcare access for all.

SUPPORTING UKRAINE AMID CRISIS



One of our key humanitarian partners, Nova Ukraine, recently suffered damage to a medical warehouse during the nationwide strikes. We are deeply relieved that their team is safe. This incident, however, highlights the fragility of the humanitarian lifelines sustaining Ukraine's most vulnerable communities.

As Nova Ukraine works to assess losses, reroute essential supplies, and maintain medical aid delivery, Medical Bridges remains fully committed to supporting them and all partners on the ground. Our priority is ensuring that hospitals and clinics across Ukraine continue receiving the lifesaving materials they urgently need during this escalating crisis.
