
FAITHFULLY FORWARD COVID 2021-22 PROTOCOLS

Students in School: We look forward to welcoming our students back to the hallways of Charlotte Catholic High School. We continue to prioritize in-person learning knowing this is the optimal environment for our students' holistic development. Charlotte Catholic will meet in person this school year. There is no option to elect full-remote learning.

School Environment: When students return to their classrooms, they will feel a sense of safety and excitement. They will no longer see barriers or signage limiting their movement and interactions. The hallways and bulletin boards will reflect opportunities for our students to learn and grow in faith and academics and get involved in our school community.

LEARNING CONTINUUM

Cleaning

In the spring of 2021 our school community returned to normal routines for cleaning and disinfecting measures. Our classrooms and hallways are prepared to welcome students back. We will continue with standard cleaning and disinfecting protocols in place.

Transportation



Transportation is available for the 2021-2022 school year. Buses will run at normal capacity with increased cleaning measures in place. Buses will have assigned seating with siblings paired together. Face coverings or masks are optional for bus riders and drivers.

Volunteers



We are thankful to have such strong supporters who impact our everyday operations. All volunteers and visitors are asked to please check in at the front vestibule. The receptionist will notify the person with whom you are meeting.

Stay Home

WHAT WILL THE RESPONSE BE FOR A POSITIVE COVID CASE WITHIN THE SCHOOL COMMUNITY?

If your child or a family member tests positive for COVID, please contact the CCHS nurses' office at 704-716-2424 or kaholder@charlottecatholic.com immediately. If contact tracing is necessary, the CCHS Administration will communicate with the appropriate individuals, including the local health department. COVID cases will not be reported community wide to protect the privacy of those affected. We do not communicate any other illness or health concern to our wider school community.





WHAT IS THE PROTOCOL FOR CONTACT TRACING ON CAMPUS?

In the spring of 2021 we decreased our social distancing and contact tracing measures to 3 feet. Data collected diocesan wide during the implementation of this change has shown that no additional spread resulted in our schools. Our protocol for contact tracing for the 2021-2022 school year will include siblings, carpool members and those identified as a direct contact (within 3 feet for 15 minutes or longer) with a positive case.

Contact school nurse or designee.

Quarantine for 7 days and negative COVID test on or after day 5. Continue to monitor for symptoms daily through day 14.

10 day quarantine.

Contact school nurse or designee.

Contact tracing will be conducted to prevent the spread of infection. Tracing will include siblings, carpool members and those identified as a direct contact (within 3 ft. for 15 min. or longer) with a positive case.

If an individual has been fully vaccinated, they are not required to quarantine if exposed to someone with COVID-19.

If an individual has tested positive for COVID in the past 90 days, they are not required to quarantine if exposed to someone with COVID-19.

Both scenarios will require documentation.



If a member of the school community tests positive for COVID, they must contact the school administration/nurse immediately. If contact tracing is necessary, the administration/nurse will communicate with the appropriate individuals. COVID cases will not be reported within our school communities to protect the privacy of those affected.
