

OUTDOOR LEARNING SCHOOL AND YOUR CHILD

Philosophy

We believe that thoughtful and active learning outdoors in a supportive community allows us to connect and relate to others and to the natural world, which together enables and inspires us to act wisely.

We believe that Outdoor Learning is most effective when all four dimensions of wellness are exercised: mental, physical, emotional, and social. We believe that learning is about who we are, how to live well with others, and how to grow joy and balance.

We believe that nurturing a sense of connection grows compassion and responsibility: to oneself, to others, and to the natural world.



COMMON QUESTIONS about Outdoor Learning

Where will learning and teaching take place?

Using nature's lens to teach the Ministry's mandated curriculum, students will learn in a variety of settings around the South Canoe School. On occasion, locations may change based on seasons and animal movements throughout the year, with parents dropping-off/picking-up off-site on those days.

The school site itself also provides an indoor learning environment. Most outdoor school models in B.C. seem to begin around 20% outdoors early in the year, leading up to spending as much as 85% outdoors by years-end. These numbers are based on other sites and may not reflect exactly what actually happens at South Canoe. Classrooms will be strategically used in a workshop-style approach, where many rooms will be designated for different purposes such as a literacy room, numeracy room, fine arts and music room, kitchen, and hands-on building rooms.

How will students' comfort and safety be assured?

Ongoing training in first aid, risk assessment, emergency preparedness, and planning for outdoor experiences will be assured. With preparation and support, students will be exposed to a variety of weather conditions and physical challenges. Dressed in the right gear, students around our province have proven able to handle

all weather conditions, and students and teachers at South Canoe will be no different. Temperature cut-offs will be clear to parents once the school begins, and attention will always be given to other possible safety concerns such as under-dressed students, animal sightings, and windy days in or near forests.

Will special needs students be fully integrated with adequate support?

The school is covered by the same policies and guidelines with respect to inclusion as other district schools. The goal is to build a learning community in which all students can flourish. Students with needs that garner CEA support will do the same at South Canoe, and an LRT will be hired to meet the demands of the school population.

Who are the teachers?

We have an amazing staff at South Canoe which include passionate and caring teachers, CEAs, clerical and administration. In addition, there are many other educators at the school. They include students, community members, elders, family members, the natural spaces around the school and community (i.e. plants, animals, rivers, wetlands, forests, and mountains) and locations around the Shuswap (i.e. farms, businesses, public institutions, public streets and squares, artists' studios).

If the program is not a good fit for my child, can he/she return to their home school the following year? How about if they are in French Immersion?

Your child may return to their home school, however this would be dependent on available space, otherwise they could attend the regular program at the nearest school that could accommodate them. A child in French Immersion can opt out of French Immersion for one year to attend the South Canoe Outdoor Learning Program. If they decide to opt out for more than one year they could join the late Immersion group at Grade 6, but would no longer be eligible for early immersion.





Expectations of Parents

- To provide transportation to the South Canoe Outdoor Learning School. Students will walk a great deal at this school as they get from place to place around the South Canoe community, with regular visits to the South Canoe trails, Klahani park and local South Canoe residents' properties.
- Sometimes, the school day will occur at other sites in the Salmon Arm area, in which case parents will be asked to drop-off and pick-up at that site.
- To ensure that your child is properly dressed for all weather conditions. Your child's comfort in the outdoors will go far to nurturing a positive attitude and engagement. Extra outdoor clothing does not have to be new, but rather well-fitted and effective. A list will be sent to families once teachers are hired and a program is formalized. As a parent, this could also mean additional laundry as your child explores the outdoors. We also have a contingency plan for families for whom this may cause a financial hardship.

How do I register my child?

New registration for September 2020 will **OPEN** on **Tuesday, October 8th** at 9 a.m. Please register at South Canoe Elementary.

If you are new to the school district, and in order to meet Ministry of Education requirements, please bring appropriate proof of citizenship or status in Canada for both students and parents, and appropriate proof of age for students. Examples are an original birth certificate, passport, baptismal certificate, immigration or refugee documentation. If required please bring proof of guardianship and appropriate proof of residence. A most recent report card from previous school, if available, would also be helpful. If you are registering a child entering kindergarten please bring your child's immunization record, and BC Services Card. Medical and emergency contact information would be greatly appreciated.
