The proposal closes a \$37.86 billion shortfall while protecting key investments in education, public safety, addressing homelessness, mental health care reform, and climate action. The California Film Commission (CFC) is proud to announce a significant boost to California's entertainment industry economy with the addition of five big-budget projects and ten independent films into Film and Television Tax Credit Program.

These fifteen productions, spanning a diverse range of budgets and narratives, are projected to bring close to \$408 million into California's economy through qualified in-state expenditures. With an estimated 2,252 crew, 598 cast, and 16,800 background performers poised to work across a combined 579 filming days, these projects will provide a substantial boost to local employment and economic activity. ### POWER FORWARD ZEV BATTERY MFG GRANT - UPDATE

A battery manufacturing grant funding opportunity called PowerForward is under development. An application manual is expected to release in Q1 2024 with the eligibility criteria and application deadline.

A pre-application workshop will also be announced alongside the PowerForward manual release to share more details, answer questions, and receive comments from prospective applicants.

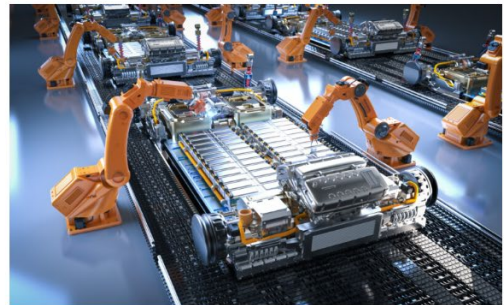

CALSTART, with support from New Energy Nexus (NEX), manages the PowerForward – Battery Manufacturing Grant Program, funded by the California Energy Commission (CEC). PowerForward is California's market-accelerating, \$25 million grant program designed to:

- Attract and retain zero-emission vehicle (ZEV) battery manufacturing in California
- Directly and indirectly create high-quality jobs
- Create positive economic impacts that benefit local communities and priority populations
- Contribute to California's goal of zero-emission transportation

### CAL FIRE BUSINESS AND WORKFORCE DEVELOPMENT

CAL FIRE's Wood Products and Bioenergy team seeks to maintain and enhance the wood products infrastructure of California to promote healthy resilient forests throughout the state by supporting a diverse set of business development and workforce development projects.

Eligible business development projects include facilities, operations, and professional services that support the restoration of healthy, resilient forests. Eligible workforce development projects include universities, colleges, government and community organizations, and businesses that aim to increase workforce capacity in the fields of logging, fuels treatment, transportation, manufacturing, or other support services that bolster the development of a resilient forest sector workforce. The proposed solicitation is intended to help potential applicants including California Native American Tribes, low-income, and disadvantaged communities access funding for ZEV infrastructure.</p>

Per the 2021 Senate Bill 100 Joint Agency Report, achieving 100% clean electricity in California requires an acceleration of the development of rooftop solar projects. CalAPP funding is intended to encourage cities and counties to further enhance permitting processes and accelerate processing and turnaround time, particularly regarding plan review.
