Public charter schools, which are tuition-free and open to everybody, have become an increasingly popular choice for parents. Just like different colleges have different strengths, different public charter schools can specialize in areas like STEM or the arts for students interested in those pathways.

Enrollment in North Carolina public charter schools is up 19.2% since 2019, and it has more than tripled in the past decade.
