WE ARE LEARNING:

RELIGION: We had limited time in religion this week due to ILEARN testing, but in our time together we learned about Our Lady of Fatima and the Miracle of the Sun, discussing its significance and what it teaches us about faith. 4B also spent time practicing for our class Mass next week.

MATH: This week in math, we had limited instructional time due to ILEARN testing. During our class time, we focused on reviewing key skills by playing math

bingo and completing other engaging review activities. Students also finished the final days of their math review packet in preparation for the math ILEARN assessment on Monday.

READING: Next Monday we will finish our novel, *Charlie and the Chocolate Factory*. On Tuesday there will be a vocabulary test over 12 of the vocabulary words from the packet and on Wednesday the students will take an end of the novel test (multiple choice and 1 essay question). Thursday we will be watching the original movie and comparing it to our novel-all while enjoying our treats! 🍫🍬

Spelling : Unit 26 (Words with -ed that sound like t) Activities and test will be due next Thursday.

ELA: Next week we will be learning about Point of View through 3 different perspectives- 1st Person 2nd Person 3rd Person

SOCIAL STUDIES: This week we will continue Unit 5 (Lessons 3 & 4). Our topics will include: WWI, Allied Forces/Axis Powers, Europe before and after the war, The Great Depression, The New Deal under President Roosevelt, WWII and The Civil Rights Movement. There will be vocabulary, comprehension questions, class discussions and mapping.

Important Message:

Miss Bridges and myself are receiving quite a bit of late work in all subject areas. We have talked to our students several times about the importance of turning in homework on time. We are past the point in the year of constant reminders, especially when all students record their assignments down in their agendas. If your child is absent, then they get one extra day to complete their work. All other late work will be given half credit only.
