The Lessons

A reading from the Prophet Hosea (11:1-11)

Una lectura del profeta Hosea

When Israel was a youth, I loved it dearly, and out of Egypt I called my child. But the more I called them, the further they turned from me, making sacrifices to the Ba'als, and burning incense to carved images. I taught Ephraim to walk, taking them by the arm, but they didn't acknowledge that I was the one who made them whole. I led them on a leash of human kindness—with bonds of caring. I removed the yoke from their necks and stooped to feed them. Now they will return to Egypt and

Assyria will rule over them because they refuse to return to me. Swords will flash in their villages, destroying their gates and devouring them because of their plans. My people are determined to turn away from me! Even though they cry out to the heights, they will not be lifted up. How can I abandon you, Ephraim? How can I hand you over, Israel? How can I make you like Admah? How can I treat you like Zeboiim? My heart is aching within me; I am burning with compassion! No, I can't do it! I cannot act on my righteous anger! I will not turn around and destroy Ephraim! For I am God—no mere mortal—the Holy One who walks among you! They will follow the Lord, who will roar like a lion! When they hear that great roar, the children of God will return from the west, trembling. They will come out of Egypt trembling like sparrows, from Assyria, like doves. I will resettle them in their own homes," says the Lord.

A Reading from Paul's Letter to the Colossians (3:1-11)

Since you've been resurrected with Christ, set your heart on what pertains to higher realms, where Christ is seated at God's right hand. Let your thoughts be on heavenly things, not on the things of earth. After all, you died and now your life is hidden with Christ in God. But when Christ—who is your life—is revealed, you too will be revealed with Christ in glory. So put to death everything in you that belongs to your old nature: promiscuity, impurity, guilty passion, evil desires, and especially greed, which is the same thing as idolatry. These are the sins which provoke God's wrath.

Your own conduct was once like this, when these things were your very life. But now you must rid yourselves of them all: anger, rage, malice, slander and abusive language. Stop lying to one another. What you have done is put aside your old self with its past deeds and put on a new self, one that grows in knowledge as it is formed in the image of its Creator. And in that image, there is no Greek or Hebrew, no Jew or Gentile, no barbarian or Scythian, no slave or citizen. There is only Christ, who is all in all.

The Eucharistic Prayer

Enriching Our Worship, Prayer 3

God be with you. And also with you.

Lift up your hearts. We lift them to the Lord.

Let us give thanks to the Lord our God. It is right to give our thanks and praise.

Praise and thanks are yours, our Creating God. . . And so we give you thanks, rejoicing with all of Creation, as we join the saints and angels in their unending hymn: Holy, holy, holy Lord, God of power, of power and might. Heaven and earth are full of your glory. 2x Hosanna, in the highest, blessed is he who comes in the name of the Lord. 2x

On the night that Jesus was betrayed, he took bread, and gave thanks to God. He broke the bread, gave it to his friends and said: "Take and eat, for this is my body, given for you. Do this in remembrance of me."

He took the wine, and gave thanks to God, Creator. He gave it to his friends saying: "This is my blood of the new covenant, shed for you and for all creation for the forgiveness of sins. Every time you drink of the wine, do this in remembrance of me."

So we proclaim the mystery of faith:(Lower voices lead. Higher voices echo.) Christ has died. Christ is risen. Christ will come again.

Merciful God, we come to this table seeking reconciliation . . . Through Christ and with Christ and in Christ, in the unity of the Spirit, all honor and glory is yours, everlasting God, now and forever. **AMEN.**

And now, as our Savior Christ has taught us, we are bold to sing, Our Father who art in heaven, hallowed be thy name. Thy kingdom come, thy will be done on earth as it is in heaven. Give us this

day our daily bread, and forgive us our trespasses as we forgive those who trespass against us. And lead us not into temptation. But deliver us from all that is evil. For thine is the kingdom and the power and the glory for ever. Amen. Amen. Amen.

A period of silence follows as the Bread is broken. We break this bread to share in the body of Christ. **Though we are many, we are one body, because we all share in one bread.**

Wherever you find yourself on the journey of faith you are welcome to receive the bread and wine made holy. The minister will dip the bread into the wine and then place it in your cupped hands. Please do not attempt to take the wafer from the minister. If you need gluten-free wafers, please say "gluten free." Let an usher know if you would like a minister to bring communion to you in your seat.
