Front Pew Crew

Our youngest ones, ranging in age from 5 – 11, sit in the front two pews with an adult volunteer. They each have a clipboard of their own that is stocked each week with items related to the liturgy and liturgical season. Each clipboard also contains drawing materials which provide our children the opportunity to have their “own stuff.” The children often draw their own pictures of the front of the sanctuary which sparks wonderful conversations about the items and colors that are present. Their drawings are then used as a bulletin cover for future Sundays. They love to see their name and artwork displayed! Each Sunday, the children are supplied with a bulletin of their own and they track each part of the service, learning how to look up the next hymn, participate in responsive readings, prepare for the offering and offer prayers among other things. They frequently raise their hand to offer a prayer during the Prayers of the People and two of them serve as acolytes each week. Sitting in the front allows them to feel seen and valued.

To enrich the spiritual experience for your congregation, consider how visual arts are integrated into your worship space. This quick sheet provides resources to enhance the visual presence of your different worship spaces.

MIX UP YOUR MEDIA!

Consider how fiber arts, sculpture, pottery, mosaic, photography and more could be used.

Getting Started:

- Are they projected on screens?
- Can you find visual arts within your weekly bulletin?
- Are they integrated into your architecture?
- Are there communal art projects that all ages can work on together?
- Is there a liturgical arts team that changes the look of the sanctuary for different seasons?
- Do you have visual artists in your congregation?

IN HOUSE ARTISTS! Invite the children of the congregation to create artwork that could be photographed for use in a variety of ways, such as projected slides, bulletin covers, or cards for a church member. These could also be displayed in the narthex or other areas of the church.

DID YOU KNOW? To find artwork that requires only a Creative Commons license, you can use Advanced Google Image Search and set the "usage rights" to this option. This helps when trying to show an image for a metaphor or theme you may be using.
