Supply chain issues are impacting all areas of our lives but the orders of these palms mean livelihood for harvesters, now, more than ever.



PALM SUNDAY IMPACT

From Jerusalem, to Petén to Sunday Palm in Minnesota. The tradition has survived for almost two thousand years. After the entry of Jesus, the symbol of the palm branch was solidified forever.

For more than 15 years, Rainforest Alliance, through USAID funding, has worked with Eco-Palms to connect faith-based communities in the United States with communities in Guatemala's Maya Biosphere Reserve to provide palm fronds for Easter week celebrations.

Uaxacatún and Carmelita are two of the communities in Guatemala's Maya Biosphere Reserve that harvest, prepare and package the palms for Eco-Palms and the Holy Week celebrants in the United States. They have benefits year after year from the generous connection made through this program.

Community members are proud of this durable relationship which has helped improve the livelihoods of families in these forest communities and helped them protect Central America's most important rainforest.

Congregations that order Eco-Palms should receive an email containing your order number the day you place your order. The Monday before Palm Sunday, customers can log into their account to get the FedEx tracking number to show when the palms should arrive.

Staying Faithful to God's Creation

The first two weeks of the new administration have been predictable, at least from an environmental viewpoint. The League of Conservation Voters gives Lee Zeldin, the new head of the EPA, a 14% lifetime score for his record. In 2022, he favored an amendment that would have cut the EPA's budget, voted for pulling the US out of the UN Framework Convention on Climate Change, and opted against investment in conservation and restoration of America's wildlife.

As faithful Christians who believe in protecting God's creation, many of us are asking, "Where do we go from here?" The Bible provides the answer: "Rejoice in hope; be patient in affliction; persevere in prayer. (Romans 12:12)

Much of my hope lies in the small and large communities embracing local actions to tackle environmental issues in their backyards. For example, in this issue, you'll read about ordinary citizens working to reduce Evanston, Illinois' carbon footprint through promoting healthy buildings. It's an excellent example of the "think global, act local" strategy. You can also learn about the sustainability fair held by St. Mark Presbyterian Church in Newport Beach, CA, demonstrating how we can spread environmental education from the bottom up.

But much work remains in communities worldwide. Don't miss Richard Randolph's powerful piece about the environmental devastation caused by the war in Ukraine, Mary Beene's review of Bruce McLaren's book offering a sobering assessment of our future, and Nancy Corson Carter's take on a documentary about the ubiquity of plastic in our world.

As we look ahead to the next four years, let's set our sights on rejoicing in hope, being patient in affliction, and persevering in prayer. Eric Diekhans, Editor

SINCE THE ARSON FIRE OF MAY 22, 2023, the First Presbyterian Church of Douglas has continued its ministry of worship and service to the community. They have discerned that God is calling them not to rebuild what was, but rather to build for what God is calling them toward.

Pastor Peggy Christiansen provided a powerful witness during the sentencing hearing of the man who burnt the churches: "Your Honor, we would like Mr. Ridenour to know that his actions—as devastating as they have been to us—have not stopped our ministry.



"We will have a building again, where we will continue to welcome anyone with a loving heart to share in our ministry. We will continue to provide safe harbor to those who need it most. We will continue to live our commitment to a Lord who reached out to everyone, no matter their gender, status, sexual identity, state of mind, wealth or poverty, health or illness.

"We pray for him. We hope that. . . he might one day see and accept the true love of God, which can transform even the most damaged and broken of us, and we pray that one day he might be set free of the hatred that drives him.

"In the meantime, our ministry of Love will continue. We are not defeated."

"PRESBYTERIAN CHURCH (U.S.A.) LEADERSHIP recently shared plans with World Mission staff to reduce the number of mission co-workers serving abroad by at least 50%" reported the [Presbyterian Outlook](#) on January 23, 2025. We are grateful for the 40+ year partnership of PCUSA World Mission has been a partner of FDC and pray that our partnership can continue.

[Miriam Maldonado and Mark Adams](#) are Mission Co-workers who are sent by PCUSA. We have not received any information from PCUSA leadership as to whether they will be among the 50% of the Mission Co-workers let go or, if retained, whether they will continue to be assigned to serve with Frontera de Cristo.

National Interfaith Power & Light Suspends Operations; Interfaith Power & Light

Affiliate Network Continues to Lead and Advance Mission

For Immediate Release: January 23, 2025

Statement from Interfaith Power & Light — a national organization that works in all 50 states and U.S. territories to inspire and mobilize people of faith and conscience to take bold and just action on climate change – on the decision to suspend national operations, and look to network of Interfaith Power & Light state and regional affiliates to continue to lead and advance mission:

“After much careful deliberation, the board of Interfaith Power & Light (IPL) National has made the difficult decision to suspend its central office’s operations, effective January 17, 2025. To be clear, the work of the state affiliates, each its own independent entity, continues unabated, and it is from these groups that much of the IPL network’s prodigious output has come over the years, and will continue to emerge.

“Despite the unwavering passion and commitment of our staff, partners, and supporters, the national NGO, that offered logistical and other support to the network of IPL affiliates, faced financial challenges that it was unable to overcome – even as the impact of the network as a whole came to be ever more centered in the affiliates.

“Still, IPL national’s efforts have been transformative: mobilizing advocates to facilitate the passage of historic climate legislation like the Inflation Reduction Act; supporting and funding sustainability projects at houses of worship across the country, and highlighting exemplars as Cool Congregations; educating and engaging hundreds of thousands of people of faith through programs like Faith Climate Action Week; faithfully testifying before agencies like the Environmental Protection Agency to pass groundbreaking rules for climate

progress; and much more. These efforts have made a deep impact within and beyond the IPL network, with many of them on their way to being re-visited and re-housed elsewhere.

“We extend our deepest gratitude to the dedicated staff at the national office, a few of whom have worked for Interfaith Power & Light for decades, who have poured their hearts into advancing the work of caring for our Sacred Earth. We celebrate their many accomplishments – and alongside the affiliate network, we are now discerning how these initiatives might take new shape in the emerging collaborative future we’re building together.

“We also want to thank our passionate network of supporters across the country, people of all faiths and traditions, who have supported and joined our work of creating a more just and sustainable future for all. That work continues unabated, ably led by the affiliates themselves, through its Network Steering Committee.

“IPL state and regional affiliates across the country have been, and continue to, mobilize people of faith and conscience into action. IPL affiliates are independent 501c3 organizations, committed to working locally to advance climate justice and build sustainable communities – and they do so in connection and collaboration with one another, as well as with treasured partners across the faith and environmental landscape. We encourage all our supporters, donors, funders, and partners who have supported the national IPL network [to find and connect with, or to redouble your support for, your local affiliate](#), as they continue to lead on climate action in your community.

“We remain hopeful that the foundation we have built together – the relationships, the advocacy, the programs, and the momentum we have generated – will continue to serve as a catalyst for progress. Our faith traditions and spiritual practices call us together in the shared belief that we must care for this planet and for those most impacted by the climate crisis. The work continues on across this network and within each of us.”
