Foothills Presbytery Highlights:

In 2009, Foothills Presbytery established the Stewardship of Creation Enabler (SCE) ministry. During the November 2009 Presbytery meeting at Eastminster Church, the commissioners granted Manella Calhoun the opportunity/responsibility to serve in this capacity.

At that time, the ministry was supported by the PCUSA Environmental Ministries and the Foothills Presbytery Mission Team, continuing now through the encouragement of Presbytery staff. Through this ministry, for congregations and others within the Presbytery, we encourage education and seek to provide motivation and opportunities to acquire the knowledge needed to sustain a long-term, spiritually vital commitment to God through His Creation.

Since 2010, the Foothills Presbytery E-news makes available the current SCE Connections newsletter connecting Foothills Presbytery and the PC USA Environmental Ministries, now under the guidance of the PC USA Mission Agency. This newsletter provides information and links for resources to assist churches, groups and individual families in the location of services and opportunities to preserve God's Creation and to improve health.

Through the connections with the Environmental Ministries:

- Buc Outdoor Center received its Green Leaf Certification in 2011, and maintained this certification while in operation, and
- North Anderson Community Church Presbyterian remains an Earth Care Congregation. This designation demonstrates that this church is active in earth care and in caring for others through activities and projects in the fields of worship, education, facilities and outreach. Currently, there are 4 SC churches and 17 NC churches with this designation.

Does your church need to reduce your Facilities and Grounds expenses? By taking a critical look at your facilities and becoming more aware through education, you can make a difference! Consider taking the "Earth Care Pledge" and become an Earth Care Congregation, too! This designation IS influential within the PC USA denomination, even when funds might be needed to finance improved church building infrastructure.

Watch for the General Assembly Restricted Funds Application for Unassigned Funds Grant that is mailed in March of each year. We encourage your church staff to carefully consider the list of funds available and share the information for possibilities within church committees and members. In 2016, with encouragement from our Presbytery staff, I submitted an application for

and <u>received</u> assistance from the line item "Mission program with preference given to advocacy for Environment and Evangelism". Thus the new 501c3 non-profit corporation, "Critters and More, On-The Go!" officially begun!

Through "Critters and More, On-The-Go!", the mission of our board of directors is to provide children, youth, and adults the opportunities to discover the ways and wonders of many forms in nature, experiencing with 5 senses (smell, hear, touch, see, and taste), and with opportunities to use these experiences to grow in Mind, Body, and Spirit:

- Mind with Hands on activities and programs to support The South Carolina Standards and Performance Indicators, custom-tailored to match a classroom or interest topics
- > Body with Moderate physical exercises to compare and study animal and human capabilities, similarities and differences
- Spirit with Experiences that relate Creation to the Creator through the verbal, written, and/or display materials, modeling and teaching stewardship of God's creation that help us learn our place in His creation.

With prior arrangements, displays, activities and/or programs can be designed for varied age, interest and skill level. We travel to schools, churches, camps, festivals and other gatherings within the boundaries of South Carolina. As grants and donations are received, the programs are provided free to participants. Contributions are tax deductible and sincerely appreciated.

Since January 2018, we have presented activities and/or programs for over 4,000 individuals, of all ages which include: 2 school programs, 3 church programs, 6 festivals and 6 summer camp days! To enhance what we do and how we do it, we have developed partnerships with SC Department of Natural Resources, Clemson University Extension Agency, Bob and Betsy Campbell Museum of Natural History at Clemson University, Bob Campbell Geology Museum at the SC Botanical Garden Nature Center.

We hope that our efforts will encourage participants to study and learn more about the natural world around them, and particularly, where they are. We are learning as we go as well!

Martin Luther nailed his 95 Theses to the door of the Wittenberg Castle Church, thus lighting the flame of the Reformation; he was a lover of nature as witnessed in many of his sayings, including these 2:

"Even if I knew that tomorrow the world would go to pieces, I would still plant my apple tree."

"God writes the Gospel not in the Bible alone, but also on trees, and in the flowers and clouds and stars."

Stephen Jay Gould, a well-known Paleontologist, wrote "we cannot win this battle to save species and environments without forging an emotional bond between ourselves and nature for we will not fight to save what we do not love".

God has provided us with a vibrant world in which to live. He wants us to appreciate and take care of His Creation, which includes each of us as well!

Don't Fear, You Good Earth

A Thanksgiving Hymn by Carolyn Winfrey Gillette

"Do not fear, O soil; be glad and rejoice, for the LORD has done great things!... Do not fear, you animals of the field, for the pastures of the wilderness are green; the tree bears its fruit, the fig tree and vine give their full yield..." Joel 2:21-23, Lectionary Reading for Thanksgiving 2018

Thanksgiving is a time to celebrate the goodness of what God has done and to remember our responsibility to care for God's gifts. As we have been blessed, so we are called to bless the earth and to care for it.

"Do not fear' is the most common command in Scripture. Distinctive of Joel [Thanksgiving Day lectionary reading, Year C] is the divine address to soil (v. 21) and wild animals (v. 22; cf. 1:10). Not only are God's people restored (v. 23) but also nature's potency, indicated in the renewal of the land. Joel's prophetic message, one that conveys both judgment and restoration, bears a distinctly ecological thrust." [1]

This hymn gives thanks for God's care for creation (verses 1 - 3), acknowledges our sin that damages and destroys it, and is a prayer that we may be good stewards of what God has made.

In December 2018, government delegates from around the world will meet in Katowice, Poland to decide how to implement the Paris Agreement. **The faith community will be there again to support action on climate.** IPL is joining the People's Demands for Climate Justice -- a joint global call to government delegates demanding that this year's climate talks actually lead to meaningful, just climate solutions.

The latest UN climate reports underscore the need for a more rapid shift to clean energy, and tension is building within those countries still heavily dependent on coal — including the host country of Poland. And even though the U.S. under the Trump administration has said it will abandon the Paris Accord, they cannot do that formally until 2020, and are expected to play a "big role" in the Poland talks, possibly advocating for a fossil fuel agenda.

Sign the petition to call on the UN delegates to listen to the People's Demands, not Big Polluters.

Recently, the world's leading climate scientists warned that we have only 12 years to begin the massive transformation needed to avoid the worst effects of climate change. If governments don't agree on strong guidelines for the Paris Agreement this year, our next chance won't be until 2023. That will be too late for millions of people around the world, many of whom are already experiencing climate change's devastation.

Tell U.N. delegates you want meaningful and just climate solutions to be put in place now.

Over the past couple of years the faith community has been a huge part of the conversation on the world stage demanding action on climate. In 2015 IPL went to COP 21 in Paris to present a scroll with a list of faith communities who pledged to reduce their carbon pollution 50% by 2030 and to become carbon neutral by 2050. Since then faith communities across the nation have pledged that even though our current administration is pulling out of the Paris Agreement we are "Still In Paris".

People of faith who have taken the responsibility for stewardship of our common home, must redouble our efforts. Our theology and faith traditions call us to love our neighbors and to be keepers of Creation.

Thus there will be no letting up on the work we do. We will be working harder and digging deeper into our resources. Our 20,000 congregations will continue to cut emissions and lead congregants to do the same. We will continue to help solarize buildings and homes and we will promote renewable energy at the state level. We will lead by example. But we can't do it alone. That's why we must demand that our national and world leaders take real action on climate. Sign the People's Demands for Climate Justice -- so we can bring your voice to Poland

The Midlands Master Naturalist course is part of a statewide Master Naturalist Program coordinated by Clemson University. The mission of the program is to create a corps of citizen volunteers well-trained in the fundamentals of natural history, nature interpretation, and the interface of humans and nature in order to empower them to contribute their time and talents to responsible, science-based environmental stewardship. The Midlands course is hosted by the SCWF and taught by experts in the fields of natural history, botany, biology, forestry, and geology.

Students learn identification skills, ecological concepts, and natural history of the plants, animals, and ecosystems encountered. Students will see how this knowledge can be applied to manage for wildlife and to ensure that human impacts on our Earth are sustainable. Through the established connections, participants will develop the skills necessary to become lifelong students of nature and environmental volunteers in their community.

Participants completing the course will receive South Carolina Master Naturalist certification and will be eligible to join a local chapter and participate in advanced training courses. SC Master Naturalist graduates are encouraged to log 30 hours of volunteer service for each subsequent year to maintain their certification.

Where: Classes will be held at parks and natural areas throughout the Midlands, and students will meet at the various locations. Most sites are within one hour of Columbia. Students are responsible for travel to and from field sites, although carpooling is encouraged.

When: 12 classes are held during each session - the next session will be held in Spring 2019, beginning March 15th, meeting every Friday through May 31st. At this time, only one session is held each year, in the spring.

Classes generally begin at 9:00 am at varying locations listed above. Ending times may vary depending on the field trip, but generally between 1:00-3:00 pm. Classes will be held rain or shine.

Who: The course is open to anyone, ages 18 and up. No pre-requisites or prior knowledge required. Participants come from all walks of life. Students will start with the basics.

PARTICIPANTS MUST BE IN GOOD PHYSICAL SHAPE - MANY CLASSES INVOLVE LENGTHY HIKES OF SEVERAL MILES WITH MODERATE DIFFICULTY. Because you are training to be naturalists, you will traverse the wild country and should be prepared to encounter moderate heat, briars, mosquitoes, chiggers, ticks, etc. DO NOT SIGN UP FOR THIS CLASS IF YOU CANNOT SUSTAIN THESE CONDITIONS.

We have considerable demand for this class - please ensure that you can attend the majority of classes before registering.

Preparation: Students will need to pack a lunch and be prepared for a day in the field. Please dress for the weather and bring water, sunscreen & insect repellent. Long pants are recommended, as well as good walking shoes.

Cost: \$600 per person, includes:

- South Carolina Master Naturalist Course Book
- National Wildlife Federation Field Guide to Insects and Spiders & Related Species of North America, by Arthur V. Evans
