


Courage & Renewal

What is “Listening for the Sacred Voice of Vocation and Call?”

- ◊ a unique opportunity for college students of racial-ethnic diverse backgrounds to gain professional experience & reflect upon their interests & vocation.
- ◊ a chance to get a taste of ministry in various settings. Foothills Retirement Community is excited to help coordinate this program with the assistance of the Forum of Theological Exploration (FTE).
- ◊ Our purpose is to provide 8 racially diverse college students intentional opportunities for vocational discernment in Christian leadership, including (but not limited to) pastoral ministry. Come explore God’s call & be a witness, showing that Christian leadership is valued.
- ◊ Ministry Mentors & Eli Elders (Foothills Senior Adults) will be paired with each intern. They will be available at least weekly for conversations and prayer to offer support, encouragement, & discernment.

WHO IS ELIGIBLE?

- ◊ Participants will include Upstate college students from various schools:
Anderson, Furman, Clemson, Wofford, Presbyterian College, & more
- ◊ Potential college interns may come from congregations including one of the 6 African American Congregations of Foothills Presbytery, plus John Knox, St. Giles, the Greenville Chin Presbyterian Church, the Korean Presbyterian Congregation, & other congregations.

WHERE WOULD I BE SERVING?

This 10-week ecumenical program will include area congregations and non-profit ministries, as well as the Foothills Retirement Community.
