Highlights of APF's Impact:

- Providing Fellowship grants for Israeli physicians to study at the finest institutions in the U.S. and Canada and return to Israel as experts in their fields. APF has been responsible for more than **1,500 Fellowship grants over the past 70 years.**
- Maintaining the **Emergency Medical Volunteer Program** (EMV) with the Israel Ministry of Health, which sends medical professionals to Israel to respond to catastrophic events. **Current roster is 300 volunteers and counting...**
- Funding **mass casualty trauma training** and other advanced studies for Israeli nurses. More than **200 nurses have been trained** in the past 30 years.
- Conducting the annual **Emergency and Disaster Management Course** in Israel. APF has **hosted 25 delegations** to date with two more scheduled for 2023.
- Bringing **Israeli experts and leaders to the U.S.** for interactive meetings and seminars. This is the result of our long-standing professional collaboration with the IDF Medical Corps.

It has been an honor and a privilege to hold this position for the past three years, and I am grateful to the Board for their encouragement and to the members and donors for their generosity. I must personally thank Amir Goldshtain, our Executive Director, for his constant support, determination and weathering the Covid storm!

A COURSE IN EMERGENCY DISASTER PREPAREDNESS



The 22nd annual Emergency and Disaster Preparedness Course in Israel offers reason for celebration. After two and a half years of COVID-19-related cancellations, this delegation is back. Under the auspices of Israel's Ministry of Health and the Israel Defense Forces, attendees toured the country, visited several medical institutions, attended information-packed lectures and participated in hands-on drills at the Wingate Institute and the Israel Center for Medical Simulation. During the course's 20 years of existence, over 400 healthcare professionals from North America and beyond have participated in this very important training while visiting Israel. Thanks to APF, Israel's vast knowledge in emergency preparedness is joining North American mainstream medicine.

2022 SOLOMON HIRSH MEMORIAL ISRAELI NURSES EDUCATION FUND

In September, APF funded the Nursing Licensure Examinations Department team in the Nursing Division of the Israeli Ministry of Health, a study tour to the nursing school at the University of Pennsylvania and the National Council of State Boards of Nursing (NCSBN) organization in Chicago. 
