Request for Funding Summer Learning Week 2019 Neighborhood Event

Summer Learning Day is a celebration dedicated to advocacy and awareness around elevating the importance of keeping kids learning, safe, and healthy every summer, ensuring they return to school in the fall ready to succeed. It is a chance to showcase the work you do in your community and generate increased support for summer learning in San Francisco and nationwide.

In order to support Summer Learning Day celebrations, DCYF is seeking to fund up to ten agency collaborations to host Summer Learning Day Neighborhood Events. The events will need to promote one or all of the National Summer Learning Day themes: Literacy; STEM; Arts; College & Career Readiness; and Nutrition and Wellness, and combine those National theme(s) with San Francisco's Summer 2019 theme: "We Are the City." Some examples: would your team like to focus on literacy activities? Your event could be "We are Readers!" STEM programming? "We Are Scientists!" College & Career Readiness? "We Will Succeed!" Nutrition and Wellness? "We Are Healthy!" There are no hard and fast rules – have fun and be creative with it!

Funding Criteria

In order to qualify for funding, you must:

1. Apply as a collaboration with a minimum of three agencies, one of which needs to be a DCYF OST Comprehensive Year-Round, Beacon Center or Summer Only grantee and the others can either be another OST grantee and/or Equitable Access (ExCEL) site/provider.
2. Identify a lead agency. Funds will be distributed to only one funded agency within the collaboration. This agency will be considered the "Lead Agency" and will be responsible for the budget, distribution of funds, CMS reporting and back-up documentation submissions.
3. Tie your event to the National and Citywide summer 2019 themes as stated above
4. Hold an event the week of July 8th-13th that has a youth centered focus (collaborations are also encouraged to involve families and the community at large), that includes nutrition and summer learning activities, and that is neighborhood based

DCYF will make available up to and no more than \$5,000 per event. DCYF will fund up to ten neighborhood collaborations.
