Corrales was once the BRANDY CAPITAL of New Mexico



"The house had a 'basement' that was always at 55-65 degrees. Distilled spirits were kept there...."

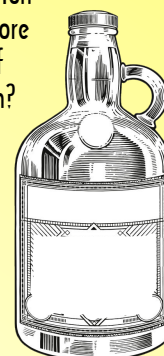


"It was illegal selling the wine, but it was good money. The wine sold for \$4.00 per gallon...you had to be real careful."
