

From Pastor Teri

Christmas Eve Scheduling

When I was in seminary, a very wise mentor told me, “Never mess with Christmas Eve, Teri. Your folks will be ok with changes in just about any other area of worship, but there’s something about Christmas Eve that’s baked into their souls.” He later qualified his advice to say that the part not to change was about including “Silent Night” and candlelight. That’s because most of Christmas Eve is about a feeling, not what’s actually said.

We’ve been collecting data on our Christmas Eve services and schedules for the past two years, and looking at data for years prior to that. We want to maximize our resources and make certain we are providing the best Christmas Eve worship experience for the most people we can, while making best use of our resources. We polled our Church Council, our choir, and selected other members of the congregation.

Data shows the noon communion service remains popular, and is the service that is growing in popularity and attendance. In contrast, our lowest attended service – by far – is the 11pm service, and very few of our own congregants attend this service. Many do not like being out that late. For the past two years, we’ve designated the 7:30pm service as the family-friendly service, and our children and youth have taken the lead in that service.

This year – after much input, discernment, and prayer – we’ve decided to discontinue the 11pm service. We’ll keep the noon communion service in the Chapel, although if it continues to grow, we may need to re-evaluate its venue in the future. And our 7:30pm service will become our “Lessons & Carols” format with a brief meditation included, as previously used at the 11pm service. We intend to include the youth and children in this service as we can.

This new approach also will allow us to revive a prior High Street tradition: the extended pre-service offering of music. We’ll engage our very talented musicians from within our congregation to provide music from approximately 6:45-7:15pm prior to the 7:30pm service beginning. We’re excited about the possibilities here. There will also still be a time of fellowship and refreshments following the 7:30pm service in Parish Hall.

We did not make this decision lightly, but we’re excited about the possibilities that open up with the new approach. We hope you’ll come to one of the two services, and invite family and friends to come with you. Each of the two services will include “Silent Night” and candlelight. After all, we know better than to change that!

September Financial Update

Our giving for Q3 was down fairly significantly. In September, our giving was \$32,812 which was \$2745 more than September expenses, but \$1771 less than we budgeted for. Fortunately, our staff was heroic in keeping expenses down and we received reimbursement from the Foundation for a couple of grants. Our total giving year-to-date (YTD), excluding the Ethel Gantz gift in May, was \$343,152, which we celebrate; but our expenses YTD totaled \$362,321. This means our expenses exceeded our Year-to-Date (YTD) giving by \$19,169; and our YTD budget of \$311,250 by \$51,071.

With the May Ethel Gantz gift and Gladys Hendricks Trust income for 2024 figured in, our income was \$368,570, which barely kept us afloat. Our budget does not cover our greatest expenses, which are salaries and building expenses. We are nonetheless grateful for your continued generosity and support.

We encourage you to remember to keep up your support as 2024 continues. If you are behind in your pledge, there is still time to catch up. Your support means everything. Stewardship Update

I want to personally thank the Stewardship Team; Mary Ann Olinger, our chair of Stewardship; and all of our Stewardship speakers who shared their stories during this year's campaign. Each of these people was truly wonderful and helpful to me and to this congregation as we looked to Earn, Save, and Give in the spirit of John Wesley, as set forth in this year's campaign.

Because our expenses are increasing, we looked to what we will need for 2025, rather than waiting to set a budget based on what we receive in pledges. As we noted in the stewardship letters that we sent out, we'll need at least \$484,260 to simply maintain the building and personnel as they are currently.

We will be providing updates of pledge totals received for the weeks leading up to the Church Council meeting at the end of November. Look for them in the e-newsletter. This is in the spirit of transparency, since we may have to make some important decisions – including personnel decisions – depending on the success of our stewardship campaign. We are optimistic, knowing that you are a generous congregation AND that you are growing in your discipleship. But we do want to keep you updated all along the way so there are no surprises.

The 2024 Election

It seems as if the election has brought out the worst in some people – even some we know and love. There is absolutely nothing wrong with having differing opinions on who might be best for a given office or position. But the vitriol, name-calling, threats, violence, and threats of violence we've all seen and heard are completely unacceptable. It costs nothing – NOTHING – to be kind. If you disagree with someone, I find it's best to ask how they came to their belief or to their position, rather than argue about it. Seldom will anyone's mind be changed either way, but a relationship may be preserved.

John Wesley had advice for those voting in elections. I commend it to you during these tense times:

“October 6, 1774

I met those of our society who had votes in the ensuing election, and advised them

1. To vote, without fee or reward, for the person they judged most worthy
2. To speak no evil of the person they voted against, and
3. To take care their spirits were not sharpened against those that voted on the other side.”



Angel Tree 2024 is just around the corner!

Angel Tree is a primary mission for High Street during the coming Advent season. Angel Tree, a program of Prison Fellowship, reaches out to the children of inmates and their families to help provide Christmas gifts for children from their incarcerated family member. This special program is an opportunity for our church to share the love of Christ with the children and families participating in the program throughout our community.

This year we have committed as a church to sponsor gifts for **80 children**. There are several ways you can be involved in Angel Tree this year.

1. Sponsor a child during our gift tag distribution.

We will be distributing gift tags at church **November 24, December 1, and December 8**. Each gift tag will contain the name, age, and gift ideas for the child. Once you pick a tag(s) you are free to shop! We ask that each gift total about 30 dollars. **All gifts are to be returned to church no later than Sunday December 15**. If shopping is difficult for you, but you would like to sponsor a child our secret shoppers are more than happy to do the shopping with your gift donation dollars.

2. Help organize gifts for delivery.

Join us on December 15 in Parish Hall from 11:00-1:00 to organize gifts by families for delivery.

3. Help Deliver Gifts to families.

Once all gifts are collected, they will be distributed to families **from December 15 - 23rd**. We will need a few volunteers to help deliver gifts to families who prefer to have gifts delivered rather than picking them up in the church office. We deliver gifts in delivery pairs. 


