## August Small Group Meetings

It was an exciting, fulfilling, tiring, but really fun month! There were 9 small group meetings at various homes and at the church, at various times of day, throughout the month. I met with 89 people associated with the church through those meetings, plus a few additional meetings separately with others who couldn't make it to one of the group meetings. Overall, I met with about 95 of you, and asked you all the same questions. You also had the chance to tell me what you wished I asked, but didn't.

There were themes: first, we have really interesting people within our congregation. I loved hearing how you introduced yourselves. I learned so much about you. You're all talented as well. I brought my (large) stack of green index cards with me to the Nominations Committee meetings. And don't be surprised if I call you up for a short term task force to put your skills to good use! In fact, I already have.

You reported coming to High Street through three main ways: you were "born into it" (that is, you had more or less always been members through their families), you married into it, or you were invited by someone. That last one is important, because study after study shows us that people come into the church by personal invitation (by someone they know).

I heard a wide variety of responses to what High Street does especially well, but the ones that came up most often included: our music, our outreach to the community (including the Samaritan Fund, the Food Pantry, and Thursday Luncheon), Update Learning, hospitality and being welcoming, generosity, and our involvement of and with older adults.

In terms of your wishes or dreams for the next 6-12 months, the most frequently mentioned were more people joining us (especially younger families), small group studies, greater financial stability for the church, and the return of Update Learning. Things were a little fuzzier around what we were willing to do to make those dreams a reality, but hopefully you've all been thinking about that since our meetings. Because dreams don't come true without the combined efforts of all of us.

I got to hear all sorts of things during the "tell me what I didn't ask that you wish I had" portion of the meetings. This is where I learned how much misinformation and confusion there is out there about disaffiliation (see the article on that in this issue of Tower Topics). I also heard quite a lot from our members who came from Garden of Gethsemane, which went through a disaffiliation. They had a lot to say about the process from an insider's viewpoint. You reported overwhelmingly enjoying the "one-service" format on Sunday mornings. You are rightfully proud of High Street's history, and the histories so many of your families have here.

It was a tremendous blessing for me to have the time to meet with you in smaller groups, to hear from you, and to simply get the chance to get to know you better. Thank you for your time. And thank you again to those who served as hosts for the meetings. We couldn't have done this without you.

The good news is that we are able to help those who previously connected with our worship services through the radio to connect in other ways. So far, we've received only 3 calls needing help. 
There are many ways to help:


- 1) Assist in making caregiver calls to determine appropriate gifts to be purchased for the children ( late October/early November)






### Contemporary Worship Service

### Disaffiliation within the UMC

Both in individual conversations with you and during the August small group meetings, it became apparent that there is a lot of confusion and misinformation about disaffiliation in the United Methodist Church. As the Chair of the Board of Trustees for the Indiana Annual Conference, which oversees all disaffiliations within the conference, I am very familiar with the process, how it works, what is required, and who is disaffiliating. Churches that disaffiliate have been planning to do so for some time. The process requires a time of prayer and discernment. Three-quarters of eligible members must vote to disaffiliate. The default position of any church is to remain within the UMC. There is no requirement to take a vote. High Street UMC will not be taking a vote; it is clear nowhere near three-quarters of our membership wishes to disaffiliate. Both within the district and throughout the Conference, we've found that votes without sufficient support for an action do nothing other than create discord and distrust within a congregation. If you find yourself believing you need to have clandestine talks "behind the pastor's back," or in the parking lot, or otherwise not in the open, stop. Any sort of meetings or talks that are held in secret are not good for the community, and are not healthy. Come to see me and let's talk. # Notes from Pastor Teri:

---

## **Thanksgiving Day Service**

I've researched the attendance at High Street's Thanksgiving Day service. There has not been good attendance for many years, including pre-COVID. Given the general lack of interest in the service (i.e., people telling me they would not attend it), and our current financial situation, it would not be good stewardship to continue this service. I know there are a few families who will miss the service.

We'll be moving the gathering of food for the Pantry (traditionally part of the Thanksgiving Day service) to our November 13 Sunday service.

## **August 2022 Giving Update**

Our giving for August was \$30,239, which was \$10,261 less than budgeted for. Overall expenses were a bit higher than planned due to some higher than expected building expenses and a one-time charge for Pastor Teri's move because we are not up to date with our conference or district tithe.

This may sound overwhelming, but as of the beginning of October, there are 13 weeks left in the year. Did you know that if 150 people gave an extra \$10 each/week, that would be \$19,500? In addition to their usual gifts and tithes? What a difference that could make! In the meantime, the staff continues to engage in tight expense controls, and search for additional ways to control costs. That said, year-to-date we continue to be below expected receipts, which has created some financial shortfalls in our operating budget as of the end of August. We are thankful for your continued support of the missions and ministries of High Street UMC, and give thanks to God for your faithful contributions!

## **Mailing Schedule for Tower Topics**
