Tish’Lara Jarvis, emergency communications officer



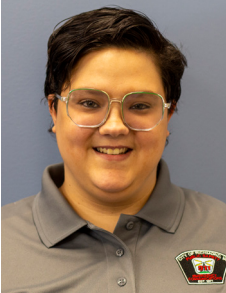
