From the Interim Associate Pastor

As I sit to write this message, our region has endured a week of ice and snow that forced us to stay inside and saw the shutdown of nearly everything around us. We are finally experiencing temperatures above freezing and the sun is rapidly melting the accumulated icy mess. While we have had plenty of experience with staying home in the last year thanks to the pandemic, we have had the ability to spend time outdoors and get around. There is something different about realizing that you are homebound and cannot go anywhere because it is physically impossible to do so.

The happiness felt at the arrival of this thaw is a reminder of the joy we experience as the cold of winter turns to the warming of spring. For us, spring brings with it the church season of Lent. In fact, the English word Lent comes from the Old English word *lencten*, meaning "spring season." As Lent unfolds, leading us to the foot of the cross, so does the world around us.
