There will also be the opportunity to work with St. Mark's Social Justice Group as they sponsor an "Offering of Letters" to U.S. Congresspersons and Senators to support the five-year re-authorization of the U.S. Farm Bill so that it builds a healthy, equitable, and sustainable food system that helps people who are "food insecure" (i.e., hungry) in the U.S. and globally. The Council has a primary goal this year to pull us all together as one body as we work toward discerning God's will for us. The Council is working for unity among all of St. Mark's ministries so we can move forward with strength and common ministry goals. We continue to have outreach into the community and beyond as a component of the work of all committees. At the regularly scheduled August meeting of the Council, we began with a prayer asking God to look upon us with compassion as we enter this next chapter in the life of St. Mark. We asked God to break

down any walls that may exist between us that could separate us from one another and from God, to unite us in love, and to guide us as we work too discern God's will for us at St. Mark.

Treasurer Marilyn Gosell reported income for July to be \$37,677 while expenses were \$44,595. The July 31 year-to-date deficit total in the General and Benevolence Funds is (\$66,386).

We acknowledged receipt of the \$90,000 Federal Government Covid reimbursement grant and again expressed gratitude to Mary Goodrich for her work in the application process. The check was deposited in the Reserve/Bequest Fund. The Council unanimously authorized using a portion of this fund to give a bonus to our current staff, including our contract maintenance worker. We foresee using the balance of the grant to reimburse the General Fund for what will be our end-of-year budget deficit.

The Council has asked Property Committee chairperson, Paul Post, to investigate and prepare a 10-year long range plan of major repairs and replacement items to assist in developing future General Fund and Capital Fund budgets. By the time you read this report, the repair to the exterior stairs leading to the upper Wille Street entrance should have been completed. That project is to be paid out of the Capital Fund budget which was approved at the February congregational meeting. Though the parsonage is generally in good condition, it is being refreshed and repaired as needed. Several members have been working very hard to accomplish this.

The Winter Farmer's Market has expressed interest in renting space at The Center beginning in December. This is both an outreach to the community as well as a way to bring the community to us, to generate some income, and to highlight our Center as a possible rental venue. Discussions of this possibility are in progress.




will collect donations (in-kind and monetary) for Health kits.

Offering of Letters is an Act of Christian Citizenship

On Sunday, September 10, members and friends of St. Mark will have an opportunity to advocate to their elected Congressional representatives on behalf of hungry people in the United States and globally. As part of "God's Work. Our Hands." Sunday, an Offering of Letters will be one of the service activities available. Printed letters will be available to be signed and envelopes addressed.

What is an "Offering of Letters"? You could call it another way of practicing Christian stewardship the stewardship of being a Christian citizen—by communicating via mail with federal representatives. Each year the bi-partisan Christian advocacy organization Bread for the World sponsors this activity to encourage the U.S. government to use its enormous capacity to address hunger on a scale far beyond what churches could do by themselves. This year's effort is more significant than the average year because the U.S. Farm Bill is up for reauthorization, something that occurs only every five years. Bread for the World is supported by the ELCA's World Hunger program.

The Offering of Letters seeks to influence several things in the 2023 Farm Bill:

- 1. Protect SNAP from further restrictions. SNAP is the Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program, formerly Food Stamps. In Illinois, SNAP by itself lifts 285,000 people above the poverty line, including 139,000 children, each year on average. Some people would like to cut or make harmful changes to SNAP's Thrifty Food Plan which is the cost of groceries needed for a healthy diet for a family of four. In 2021, the Thrifty Food Plan was updated (since 2006) resulting in a modest increase in SNAP benefits.
- 2. Increase funding for fresh produce within SNAP benefits through the Gus Schumacher Nutrition Incentive Program (GusNIP). This program provides grants to projects that help low-income consumers access and purchase fresh fruits and vegetables.
- 3. Reduce food waste by cosponsoring the Food Date Labeling Act, H.R. 3159/S. 1484. This Act will establish a "Best if used by" system. It will standardize and clarify food date labels to reduce food waste. With the exception of baby formula, date labels on food are not federally regulated or standardized. This act will save consumers money and prevent over half a million tons of food waste from entering landfills each year.
- 4. Reauthorize the Food for Peace global nutrition program at no less than its current level of \$2.5 billion annually and allow additional flexibility. In the past, U.S. food assistance was entirely shipped from the U.S. This was costly, delayed addressing hunger, and did not benefit local farmers overseas. Over time, Bread for the World and other advocates have persuaded Congress to allow more food to be purchased locally overseas. In 2020, 59 percent of U.S. emergency food was purchased locally and regionally. This is the flexibility being advocated for.

If you can assist our efforts in one of these ways, your help would be greatly appreciated.




There is a NEED for ushers on Sunday services and offering counters following worship on Sundays.

On Sunday, October 8, "Good Neighbors" from the Mt. Prospect Senior Center will join us to discuss services offered by the village.


