



Offering of Letters to address Hunger on September 10

On Sunday, September 10, as part of God's Work. Our Hands Sunday, St. Mark members will have an opportunity to sign letters and address envelopes to Representatives and Senators as part of an Offering of Letters advocating that the federal government address hunger both in the U.S. and around the world.

The Offering of Letters is sponsored each year by Bread for the World ("Bread"), an ecumenical, bi-partisan Christian advocacy organization that urges U.S. decision makers to pursue a world without hunger. Bread was started in the early 1970s by a Lutheran pastor and has achieved many victories since then thus helping to strengthen national nutrition programs and to reduce hunger in the U.S. and abroad. Bread is supported by the ELCA's World Hunger program.

This year's Offering of Letters will be particularly important because it will support the re-authorization of the U.S. Farm Bill that occurs every five years. The Farm Bill contains provisions that address people

As Congress works to renew our food and farm programs through the farm bill, I urge you to support legislation that builds healthy, equitable, and sustainable food systems.
Specifically, I ask you to: Protect SNAP from further restrictions. Increase funding for fresh produce through SNAP benefits through the Gus Schumacher Nutrition Incentive Program (GusNIP) Reduce food waste by cosponsoring the Food Date Labeling Act, H.R. 3159/S.1484. Reauthorize the Food for Peace global nutrition program at no less than its current level of \$2.5 billion annually and allow additional flexibility to provide the most effective form of assistance in each local context.

As a person of faith, I am moved to help and advocate for people experiencing hunger and poverty—no matter where they live. This is why I urge you to support a farm bill that builds healthy, equitable, and sustainable food systems.



Recapping My Ministry at St. Mark By: Deacon David

In the last eight years it has been a tremendous blessing to journey with everyone, but especially in the four specific areas of ministry that I was called to at St. Mark: Youth and Family ministry, the Adult Education Team, the Preschool, and the Church Council.



I will never be famous in the societally understood definition of the word,

thankfully. But for the last eight years I have not been able to walk down Evergreen Avenue, past the Preschool Block Room without someone yelling my name, banging on the window, and waving. Once a week I run into someone in the grocery store or at a restaurant who has been in or currently is in one of our faith formation programs. It is the joy of my heart to be famous among the under 18 crowd and especially with the 3-5 yr. old demographic.

All of the faith formation classes and eras of the last eight years will hold a special place in my heart. As will the eight-week Star Wars Bible study that we did my first year here.

In the last three years, the memorial garden, outdoor WOW!, and the vegetable gardens have been an abundant source of life. Talking with the Sarasin's while they tended the vegetable garden (especially during the pandemic), seeing Evan's Eagle Scout project culminate all of our hard work, showing the WOW! Kids how to pray in the labyrinth, chasing bubbles on the steps, and getting a feverish text and phone call from Annette Woods to "hurry up and go outside because the sunset is beautiful and probably looks even more beautiful at the church."

As many of you know, the Saito's arrival at St. Mark, baptism, return, confirmation, and sending again have been a huge part of my ministry at St. Mark as it has been for you all. Other big moments like traveling to Holden Village, receiving a grant to do Community Meal, Sundays at the Center, and the Music that Makes Community retreat and all the fun that have been part of those ministries has provided joy, insight, and energy for the new ministry.

I've loved working with each council at St. Mark, getting to know the organizational and leadership personality of this place. So many people in their service and care for this community have been a witness for faithful leadership that will guide me for all of my ministry.

Remembering my work with older adults, I am deeply grateful for the beautiful and tender relationships I've had with you all. So many people have been so kind and generous, especially with their presence over the last eight years I feel as if I've been given true wealth. I'm at a loss for words at how each person has shared their unique and special friendship and care with me. The value and richness of it all is so deep because so many of those folks have claimed their baptismal promises and joined the communion of saints. I repeatedly think fondly of the Wednesday morning Bible study crew and our deep conversation and work together that eventually became the Sunday after worship small groups and Adult Education group. I know that in the years to come I will continue to cherish the work that the Adult Education team has done in the last year and I will continue to grow from their wisdom.

And of course, one of our beginnings will always be a central part of my heart of ministry. My ordination day, my extended family visited for worship at St. Mark (including my 95-year-old grandmother), they helped me fry donuts during children's church, and many of us caravanned to First Lutheran Church in Blue Island where I looked out over a sea of 700 people and made my promises to serve God faithfully in Word and Service. In response to that promise, two children from St. Mark draped a stole over my head, affirmed my call, and reminded me that that service and faithfulness will be with them in their journey and faith.

Thank you for the richness and depth of these last eight years! I pray that God continues to bless us all abundantly in our paths, wherever they may lead.
