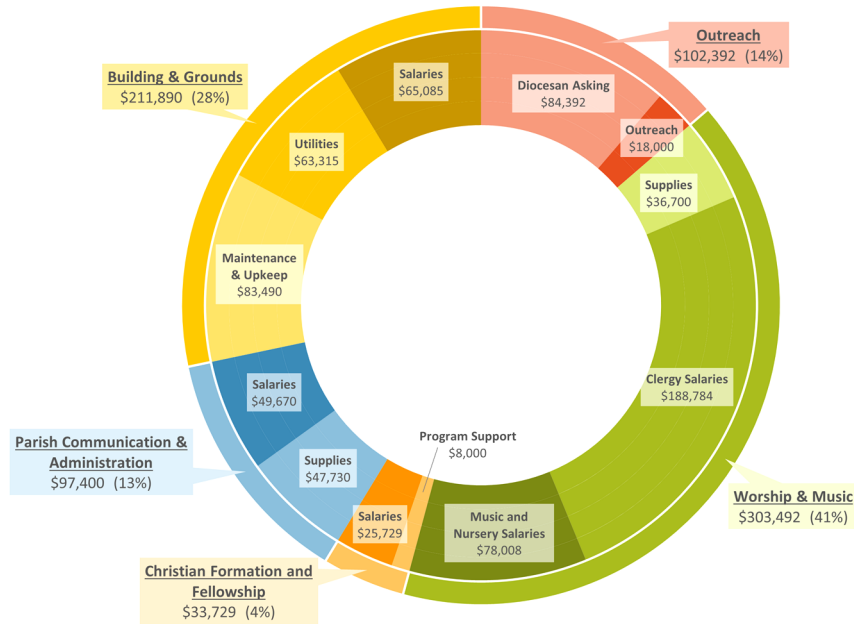

## *Stewardship*

The 2023 Stewardship Campaign is underway at CGS! Our Stewardship theme this year is “Growing Generosity”.

Members of the Church of the Good Shepherd faithfully contribute to support the mission of our parish. Your Stewardship, Finance Committees, and Vestry believe it is important to educate the congregation as to how resources are distributed based on annual revenue.

## *Winter Warmth*

The Winter Warmth Project is a service project that our Good Shepherd youth group,

“EYC” (Episcopal Youth Community), coordinates and carries out with the support of CGS parishioners.

The goal of the service project is to offer a set of hat, gloves and socks to each person that eats lunch at the Shepherd's Table Soup Kitchen. We aim to collect 300 sets each year for distribution.

The youth coordinate announcements during church and collection sites within the church to collect hats, gloves, and socks to support our neighbors that patron the Shepherd's Table Soup Kitchen.

The EYC meet in early November to sort and package donated items in individual bags for distribution at the Soup Kitchen on Veterans Day, November 11th. Members of the EYC gather on the morning of Veteran's Day at the soup kitchen and hand out the items to people after they have had lunch.

This project has been a part of the youth program at Good Shepherd for more than 15 years.

How can parishioners get involved with this outreach ministry? Parishioners can support the Winter Warmth Project

by purchasing socks, hats and gloves (preferably in neutral colors) and dropping them off in the bin in the lobby of the Parish Life Center through November 6th. Monetary donations can also be given to Devin McGinnis, CGS Youth Minister, so that we may purchase items that we do not collect through donations.

Yes! This year, the Stewardship Commitment Sunday event with "Stew"ardship Stew and the Ministry Fair will be held at the same time and place, bringing together the giving of time, talent, and treasure.

The Ministry Fair is a time for parishioners to become acquainted with the opportunities available to them to become further engaged in the life of CGS. Parishioners are invited to explore what ministries are available to them, and come see how easy it is to become involved. We hope to encourage both 'first timers' and 'old hats' to find something that is of interest to them and get involved, or more involved!

The ministries available at CGS support our parish and our neighbors in three different categories: Worship, Serving Our Parish, and Serving Our Neighbors. These three categories will point you to different areas of service to get you started. ## ***CGS Library Guild***

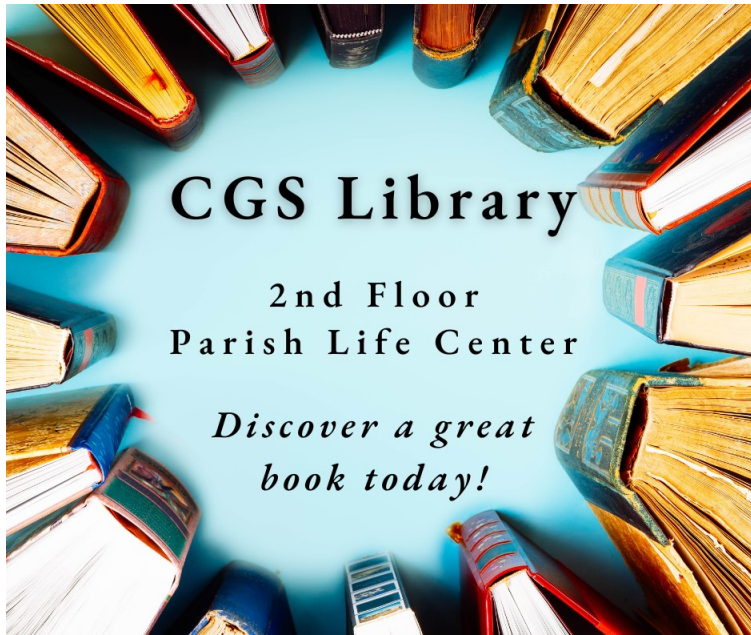
The CGS Library has a lot to offer parishioners of CGS! The Library is open for parishioners to check out books on any day that the church office is open, Monday through Thursday, 9:00am to 5:00pm. Please stop by and peruse the shelves on the 2nd floor! Here is a great article submitted by new CGS member and Library Guild volunteer, David Carter :

These days, with access to information literally at our fingertips if not in our pockets, it's easy to forget that there are places where people can gather to access, enjoy, and discuss the texts that are meaningful to them. Am I referring to church? Yes! And I'm also referring to the libraries, because I am a librarian! And I am excited to be a new member of



Good Shepherd's Library Guild!

Did you know that Good Shepherd can boast of one of the most impressive and relevant library of books on theological and adjacent topics in the diocese? The Library Guild would like to invite any and all parishioners to access and share the great news about this incredible resource!



Located on the second floor of our Parish Life Center building, the library contains hundreds of books and dozens of videos, arranged according to the Dewey Decimal System and searchable through the catalog that you can access on the library's desktop PC.

To check out an item to take home, simply write your name and telephone number and put the day's date under 'Due Date' on the circulation card that you'll find in the back of the book. Then put the card in the container marked 'Books Checked Out' located next to the computer terminal.

To return a book, all you have to do is place it in the bin next to that desk! For books that you think you might need longer than the standard three week checkout period, just let us know with a sticky note on the desk.

For those of you whom I've not yet had the chance to meet or speak with, my name is David Carter and I'm a former member of the recently closed St. Mark's Episcopal Church on New Hope Road; a graduate of the not so recently closed Episcopal Divinity School in Cambridge, MA, and I have served as a lay chaplain resident at Rex Hospital, an outreach worker with Wake County Homeless Services, and an instructor of English, Religion, and Humanities at a number of North Carolina Community Colleges.

I began paraprofessional library work in High School as a page at Richard B. Harrison Branch here in Raleigh, and from there went on to work in a number of public library systems to help pay for college and graduate school. It wasn't until just a few years ago, though, that I came to realize that library work seems to be in my DNA, as my father, grandmother and great-grandmother all worked for Durham County Library in various capacities. I graduated from the MLS program at NCCU in 2015, and since that time have been happily employed as an Instruction Librarian at Wake Tech. I don't get much opportunity there, however, to use my background in theology and ministry, so this chance to work with CGS is very exciting!

Each Other's Keeper led by Jon Stoddard in the Ennis Parlor; continues November 6th, then following a break will resume on December 4th. This series, designed by The Rev. Marc D. Smith, Ph.D., Bishop's Deputy for Gun Violence Prevention in the Episcopal Diocese of Missouri, to stimulate reflection, thoughtful conversation, and action.

Bible Study led by Debbie Moyer in room 304, on November 6th and 13th. The class is currently studying the book of Philippians.

Meal Prep For Restricted Diets led by Parish Nurse Tristin Carpenter, RN, MSN, in the Ennis parlor, on November 13th.

This year, there are many Advent events to participate in for parishioners all ages at Good Shepherd!
