1 Peter 2:19-25

Lector A reading from the first letter of Peter.

It is a credit to you if, being aware of God, you endure pain while suffering unjustly. If you endure when you are beaten for doing wrong, what credit is that? But if you endure when you do right and suffer for it, you have God's approval. For to this you have been called, because Christ also suffered for you, leaving you an example, so that you should follow in his steps.

“He committed no sin,
and no deceit was found in his mouth.”

When he was abused, he did not return abuse; when he suffered, he did not threaten; but he entrusted himself to the one who judges justly. He himself bore our sins in his body on the cross, so that, free from sins, we might live for righteousness; by his wounds you have been healed. For you were going astray like sheep, but now you have returned to the shepherd and guardian of your souls.

John 10:1-10

Gospeler The Holy Gospel of our Lord Jesus Christ according to John.

People **Glory to you, Lord Christ.**

Jesus said, "Very truly, I tell you, anyone who does not enter the sheepfold by the gate but climbs in by another way is a thief and a bandit. The one who enters by the gate is the shepherd of the sheep. The gatekeeper opens the gate for him, and the sheep hear his voice. He calls his own sheep by name and leads them out. When he has brought out all his own, he goes ahead of them, and the sheep follow him because they know his voice. They will not follow a stranger, but they will run from him because they do not know the voice of strangers." Jesus used this figure of speech with them, but they did not understand what he was saying to them.

So again Jesus said to them, "Very truly, I tell you, I am the gate for the sheep. All who came before me are thieves and bandits; but the sheep did not listen to them. I am the gate. Whoever enters by me will be saved, and will come in and go out and find pasture. The thief comes only to steal and kill and destroy. I came that they may have life, and have it abundantly."

In it your Son Jesus received the baptism of John and was anointed by the Holy Spirit as the Messiah, the Christ, to lead us, through his death and resurrection, from the bondage of sin into everlasting life.

We thank you, Father, for the water of Baptism. In it we are buried with Christ in his death. By it we share in his resurrection. Through it we are reborn by the Holy Spirit. Diocesan History Day 2026

Historic St. Mark's Episcopal Church in Halifax NC

This year marks the 250th anniversary of the Declaration of Independence. But North Carolinians have two other landmark events to observe. On April 12, 1776, three months before the signing of the Declaration of Independence, the Provincial Congress met in Halifax and adopted the "Halifax Resolves," making North Carolina the first colonial government to call for total independence from England. Later that same year, the Provincial Congress met again in Halifax and adopted the state's first constitution. Among other provisions, that constitution did away with Anglican establishment. Halifax, then, is the perfect setting for a History Day devoted to looking at the established church in Colonial North Carolina and the subsequent impact of disestablishment.

2026 Summer Mission Trip -- Registration Is Open

July 19-25, 2026

This year's Summer Mission Trip will take place the week of **July 19-25, 2026**. While this trip is being organized by the Episcopal Youth Community, both adults and teenagers (over the age of eleven) are invited to join the CGS work crew.

This year, we have decided to partner with the Appalachia Service Project (ASP). Since their founding in 1969, ASP has dedicated itself to "eradicating substandard housing in Central Appalachia and providing transformational service experiences for volunteers."

While the Good Shepherd crew has not yet received its site assignment, we have requested to be placed in western North Carolina where we can continue to assist communities affected by Hurricane Helene. Once we have been assigned to a job site, we will have more information about the work and the accommodations, both of which vary from site to site

Our Good Shepherd work team will travel together to our host site on Sunday, July 19, work Monday through Friday, and return to Raleigh on Saturday, July 25.
